AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 4 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 19 20 commissions shall be determined," further providing for 21 gubernatorial appointments and terms of office. FURTHER PROVIDING FOR THE LEASING OF CERTAIN LANDS BY THE DEPARTMENT 22 23 OF TRANSPORTATION, TRANSFERRING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE 24 PENNSYLVANIA COORDINATE SYSTEM TO THE DEPARTMENT OF 25 TRANSPORTATION AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

26 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

27 hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Subsections (c), (d), (e) and (f) of section

- 4 Section 207.1. Gubernatorial Appointments. * * *
- 5 [(c) The Governor shall nominate in accordance with the
- 6 provisions of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of
- 7 Pennsylvania and, by and with the advice and consent of two
- 8 thirds of the members elected to the Senate, appoint persons to
- 9 fill the following positions:
- 10 (1) Vacancies in the offices of Attorney General, Auditor
- 11 General and State Treasurer and in any other elective office
- 12 which he is authorized by law to fill when said law requires
- 13 confirmation.
- 14 (2) Those members which he is authorized to appoint to the
- 15 Milk Marketing Board, the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, the
- 16 Pennsylvania Game Commission, the Pennsylvania Liquor Control
- 17 Board, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and the
- 18 Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission.]
- 19 (d) The Governor shall nominate in accordance with the
- 20 provisions of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of
- 21 Pennsylvania and, by and with the advice and consent of a
- 22 majority of the members elected to the Senate appoint persons to
- 23 fill the following positions:
- 24 (1) The Secretary of Education, the Secretary of the
- 25 Commonwealth, the Adjutant General, the Insurance Commissioner,
- 26 the Secretary of Banking, the Secretary of Agriculture, the
- 27 Secretary of Transportation, the Secretary of Health, the
- 28 Commissioner of the State Police, the Secretary of Labor and
- 29 Industry, the Secretary of Aging, the Secretary of Public
- 30 Welfare, the Secretary of General Services, the Secretary of

- 1 Revenue, the Secretary of Commerce, the Secretary of Community
- 2 Affairs and the Secretary of Environmental Resources.
- 3 (2) Those members which he is authorized to appoint to the
- 4 Milk Marketing Board, the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, the
- 5 <u>Pennsylvania Game Commission</u>, the <u>Pennsylvania Liquor Control</u>
- 6 Board, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, the
- 7 <u>Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission</u>, the Board of Pardons, the
- 8 Board of Probation and Parole, the State Civil Service
- 9 Commission, the State Horse Racing Commission, the State Harness
- 10 Racing Commission, the Board of Arbitration of Claims, the
- 11 Pennsylvania Securities Commission, the Pennsylvania Industrial
- 12 Development Authority, the State Board of Education, the Board
- 13 of State College and University Directors, the Board of Trustees
- 14 of Pennsylvania State University, the Board of Trustees of the
- 15 University of Pittsburgh, the Board of Trustees of Temple
- 16 University, the Board of Trustees of Lincoln University, the
- 17 Environmental Hearing Board, the Pennsylvania Crime Commission,
- 18 the Pennsylvania Labor Relations Board, the Industrial Board,

- 23 (4) Those members which he is authorized to appoint to the
- 24 Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission, the Pennsylvania
- 25 Public Television Network Commission, the State Council of Civil
- 26 Defense, the State Farm Products Commission, the Pennsylvania
- 27 Housing Finance Agency, the Board of Trustees of each State
- 28 College and University, the Board of Trustees of Scotland School
- 29 for Veterans' Children, the Board of Trustees of Thaddeus
- 30 Stevens Trade School, the State Conservation Commission, the

- 1 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, the State
- 2 Planning Board, the Pennsylvania Drug, Device and Cosmetic
- 3 Board, the County Board of Assistance in each county, the State
- 4 Board of Public Welfare, the Boards of Trustees of Centers, the
- 5 Board of Trustees of Eastern Pennsylvania Psychiatric Institute,
- 6 the Board of Trustees of each Restoration Center, the Board of
- 7 Trustees of each State General Hospital, the Board of Trustees
- 8 of each State School and Hospital, the Board of Trustees of each
- 9 State Hospital, the State Dental Council and Examining Board,
- 10 the State Real Estate Commission, the State Registration Board
- 11 for Professional Engineers, the State Boards of Examiners of
- 12 Architects, Auctioneers, Nursing Home Administrators and Public
- 13 Accountants, the State Boards of Barber Examiners, Chiropractic
- 14 Examiners, Cosmetology, Funeral Directors, Medical Education and

- 29 (5) The general officers in the Department of Military
- 30 Affairs which he is authorized by law to appoint.

- 1 (6) Vacancies in the offices of Attorney General, Auditor
- 2 <u>General and State Treasurer, and in any other elective office</u>
- 3 which he is authorized by law to fill, when said law requires
- 4 confirmation.
- 5 [(6)] (7) All positions hereinafter statutorily created by
- 6 amendment to this act or in any other act or amendment thereto
- 7 for which Senate confirmation is specified but for which the
- 8 advice and consent of two thirds of the members elected to the
- 9 Senate is not required.
- 10 [(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of existing law
- 11 providing for the extension of a term of office until a
- 12 successor is appointed and qualified, for purposes of
- 13 appointment under Article IV, section 8 of the Pennsylvania
- 14 Constitution, for those offices requiring Senate confirmation by
- 15 this section a vacancy requiring appointment or reappointment by
- 16 the Governor shall exist upon the expiration of the number of
- 17 years or time period specified for said office.]
- 18 (f) A person, other than one serving until a successor is
- 19 appointed and qualified, nominated by the Governor to a position
- 20 for which Senate confirmation is required by this section shall
- 21 not serve in such position nor receive any compensation for
- 22 serving in such position until he has been confirmed by action
- 23 of the Senate or by its inaction as provided by the Constitution
- 24 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and his appointment or
- 25 commission thereafter issued by the Governor: Provided, however,
- 26 That nothing contained in this section shall be construed to
- 27 repeal or modify section 213 of this act[: And provided further,
- 28 That nothing in this act shall affect the right of an incumbent,
- 29 whose term of office has expired, to continue in his office
- 30 until his successor is appointed and qualified].

- 2 Section 2. Section 208 of the act, amended April 28, 1943
- 3 (P.L.94, No.52), is amended to read:
- 4 Section 208. Terms of Office. The terms of office of the
- 5 persons appointed by the Governor under the preceding section
- 6 shall be as follows:
- 7 (a) The Secretary of the Commonwealth [and the Attorney
- 8 General] shall serve during the pleasure of the Governor.
- 9 (b) The term of the [Superintendent of Public Instruction]
- 10 <u>Secretary of Education</u> shall be four years.
- 11 (c) Except as in this act otherwise provided, the heads of
- 12 other administrative departments, the Commissioner of the
- 13 Pennsylvania State Police, the members of independent
- 14 administrative boards and commissions, of departmental
- 15 administrative boards and commissions, and of advisory boards
- 16 and commissions, and departmental administrative officers, shall
- 17 hold office for terms of four years, from the third Tuesday of
- 18 January next following the election of a Governor, and until
- 19 their successors shall have been appointed and qualified or
- 20 ninety days after the expiration of the fixed term whichever is
- 21 less: Provided, That the term of the Commissioner of the
- 22 Pennsylvania State Police appointed prior to the third Tuesday
- 23 of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty nine, shall
- 24 expire upon that date, or as soon thereafter as his successor
- 25 shall have been appointed and qualified.
- 26 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of the law to the
- 27 contrary, and except as provided in this subsection, every
- 28 appointee of the Governor commissioned hereafter shall only
- 29 serve for the term of office as is set forth in the appointing
- 30 commission. No appointee shall continue to hold office after the

- 1 expiration of his fixed term pending the appointment of any
- 2 <u>successor</u>, <u>except that any appointed official whose successor</u>
- 3 <u>has not been appointed and qualified may serve an additional</u>
- 4 <u>ninety days beyond the expiration of the fixed term established</u>
- 5 in the commission. Vacancies occurring in an office for any
- 6 reason other than by expiration of term shall be filled in the
- 7 manner aforesaid for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- 8 Section 3. Any act or any part thereof which is inconsistent
- 9 with the provisions of subsections (c) and (d) of section 208
- 10 are repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.
- 11 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
- 12 SECTION 1. THE INTRODUCTORY PARAGRAPH AND CLAUSE (1) OF
- 13 SUBSECTION (C) OF SECTION 2002, ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
- 14 NO.175), KNOWN AS "THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF 1929," ADDED MARCH

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- 15 13, 1974 (P.L.194, NO.37), ARE AMENDED TO READ:
- 16 SECTION 2002. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE DEPARTMENT. --* * *
- 17 (C) ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY
- 18 NOTWITHSTANDING, THE [SECRETARY] DEPARTMENT MAY LEASE REAL
- 19 PROPERTY ACQUIRED FOR ANY STATE DESIGNATED HIGHWAY OR OTHER
- 20 TRANSPORTATION FACILITY AS IS NOT REQUIRED FOR THE FREE MOVEMENT
- 21 OF TRAFFIC, UPON THE FOLLOWING TERMS AND CONDITIONS IN EACH
- 22 CASE:
- 23 (1) THE [LESSEE SHALL BE A PUBLIC AGENCY, BUT SUCH PUBLIC
- 24 AGENCY MAY SUBLEASE TO ANOTHER PUBLIC AGENCY OR,] OPPORTUNITY TO
- 25 LEASE ANY PARCEL OF REAL PROPERTY SHALL FIRST BE OFFERED TO
- 26 <u>INTERESTED PUBLIC AGENCIES; HOWEVER, IF THERE BE NO SUCH AGENCY</u>
- 27 DESIRING TO [SUBLEASE] LEASE, THEN THE DEPARTMENT MAY LEASE TO
- 28 ONE OR MORE PRIVATE ENTITIES: PROVIDED, THAT [SUCH] ALL PRIVATE
- 29 ENTITIES SHALL MAKE PAYMENTS IN LIEU OF TAXES TO THE POLITICAL
- 30 SUBDIVISIONS IN WHICH SUCH LEASED PROPERTY IS LOCATED IN AN

- 1 AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE ANNUAL TAXES THAT WOULD NORMALLY BE DUE ON
- 2 SUCH PROPERTY, IF TAXABLE. PRIOR TO REQUIRING A PAYMENT IN LIEU
- 3 OF TAXES, THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION SHALL HAVE THE LEASED
- 4 PROPERTY REASSESSED TO REFLECT ANY CHANGE IN VALUE CAUSED BY THE
- 5 CONSTRUCTION OF THE HIGHWAY OR OTHER TRANSPORTATION FACILITY:
- 6 AND PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT THE [SECRETARY] <u>DEPARTMENT</u> MAY LEASE
- 7 [DIRECTLY] TO A PRIVATE ENTITY DURING THE INTERIM PERIOD BETWEEN
- 8 PROPERTY ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION WITHOUT FIRST OFFERING
- 9 PUBLIC AGENCIES OPPORTUNITY TO LEASE THE PARCEL.

- 11 SECTION 2. THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ:
- 12 <u>SECTION 2014. PENNSYLVANIA SYSTEM OF COORDINATES.--THE</u>
- 13 <u>DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL HAVE POWER, AND ITS DUTY</u>
- 14 SHALL BE, TO ESTABLISH AND REGULATE THE ESTABLISHMENT IN THIS
- 15 COMMONWEALTH OF THE SYSTEM OF RECTANGULAR COORDINATES WHICH HAS
- 16 BEEN ESTABLISHED AND ADOPTED BY THE UNITED STATES COAST AND
- 17 GEODETIC SURVEY FOR DEFINING AND STATING THE POSITIONS AND
- 18 LOCATION OF POINTS ON THE SURFACE OF THE EARTH, TO ESTABLISH OR
- 19 FIX TRIANGULATION AND TRAVERSE STATIONS, TO COLLECT, CHECK,
- 20 COORDINATE AND PRESERVE SURVEY DATA, TO ADVISE WITH PARTIES
- 21 <u>USING THE SYSTEM OF COORDINATES, TO SUPERVISE THE MARKING OF</u>
- 22 SURVEYS WHICH ARE TO BECOME A PART OF THE SYSTEM, TO KEEP
- 23 OFFICIAL RECORDS OF ALL SURVEYS AND MAPS, TO ADMINISTER THE LAW
- 24 ESTABLISHING THE "PENNSYLVANIA COORDINATE SYSTEM," AND TO ADOPT
- 25 AND ENFORCE SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS AS MAY BE DEEMED
- 26 NECESSARY TO CARRY THESE POWERS INTO EFFECT, AND TO ADMINISTER
- 27 THE LAW RELATING TO THE "PENNSYLVANIA COORDINATE SYSTEM."
- 28 SECTION 3. THE SUM OF \$150,000 IS HEREBY SPECIFICALLY
- 29 APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE FISCAL
- 30 PERIOD JULY 1, 1982 TO JUNE 30, 1983 FOR PURPOSES OF CARRYING

- 1 OUT THE DUTIES IMPOSED BY SECTION 2014 OF THIS ACT.
- 2 SECTION 4. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 60 DAYS.
