- 25 restricted receipts accounts for the fiscal period July 1, 1980
- 26 to June 30, 1981 and for the payment of bills incurred and
- 27 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal period ending June
- 28 30, 1980," is repealed insofar as inconsistent with this act.
- 29 Section 8. Federal funds appropriated herein shall be
- 30 encumbered or spent only to the extent that such funds are

- 1 estimated as being available prior to June 30, 1982.
- 2 Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.
- 3 SECTION 1. (A) THE FEDERAL ECONOMIC RECOVERY PROGRAM
- 4 RECENTLY ENACTED AND EMBODIED IN THE ECONOMIC RECOVERY ACT OF

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- 5 1981 (PUBLIC LAW 97-34) AND THE OMNIBUS RECONCILIATION ACT OF
- 6 1981 (PUBLIC LAW 97-35) WILL CAUSE A SERIOUS SHORTFALL IN
- 7 COMMONWEALTH REVENUES AS WELL AS A SUBSTANTIAL REDUCTION IN
- 8 FEDERAL FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR COMMONWEALTH PROGRAMS. AS A RESULT,
- 9 THE 1981-1982 FISCAL YEAR GENERAL FUND BUDGET OF THE
- 10 COMMONWEALTH WILL BE SERIOUSLY OUT OF BALANCE UNLESS IMMEDIATE
- 11 ACTION IS TAKEN TO ADJUST THE 1981-1982 APPROPRIATIONS AND
- 12 EXPENDITURES IN CONFORMITY WITH AVAILABLE REVENUES.
- 13 (B) TO REDUCE THE IMPACT OF THE REDUCTIONS ON ANY PARTICULAR
- 14 PROGRAM, A GENERAL REDUCTION IN APPROPRIATIONS MUST BE MADE.
- 15 SECTION 2. EACH AND EVERY 1981-1982 FISCAL YEAR GENERAL FUND
- 16 APPROPRIATION, EXCEPT THE APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 17 EDUCATION FOR PAYMENT OF SUBSIDIES TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS ON
- 18 ACCOUNT OF BASIC INSTRUCTIONAL COSTS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF
- 19 PROTECTING SCHOOL DISTRICTS FROM RECEIVING LESS BASIC
- 20 INSTRUCTIONAL SUBSIDY MONEY THAN WAS RECEIVED DURING THE FISCAL
- 21 PERIOD 1980-1981, FOR PAYMENTS FOR STUDENT SUPPLIES FOR
- 22 NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS, FOR PAYMENTS ON ACCOUNT OF VOCATIONAL
- 23 EDUCATION PROGRAMS, FOR PAYMENTS TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND
- 24 INTERMEDIATE UNITS ON ACCOUNT OF PUPIL TRANSPORTATION; FOR
- 25 PAYMENTS ON ACCOUNT OF NONPUBLIC SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION; FOR
- 26 PAYMENTS TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS, INTERMEDIATE UNITS AND APPROVED
- 27 PRIVATE SCHOOLS ON ACCOUNT OF SPECIAL EDUCATION OF EXCEPTIONAL
- 28 CHILDREN AND FOR GRANTS TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT
- 29 AND IMPROVEMENT OF A STATEWIDE SYSTEM OF LIBRARIES AND LIBRARY
- 30 SERVICES AND EXCEPT APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC

- WELFARE FOR COUNTY ADMINISTRATION OF THE PUBLIC ASSISTANCE AND
- 2 MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS AND FOR CASH ASSISTANCE GRANTS, IS
- 3 HEREBY REDUCED BY 1% OF THE AMOUNT OF MONEY PREVIOUSLY
- 4 APPROPRIATED IN THE ACT OF JULY 1, 1981 (NO.5A), KNOWN AS THE
- 5 "GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 1981," OR ANY OTHER ACTS MAKING
- 6 PREFERRED APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE 1981-1982 FISCAL YEAR.
- 7 SECTION 3. THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT SHALL SUPERSEDE ALL
- 8 OTHER ACTS OR PARTS OF ACTS WHICH REQUIRE OR MANDATE PAYMENTS TO
- 9 SCHOOL DISTRICTS, PERSONS, OR OTHER ENTITIES. EACH STATE AGENCY
- 10 SHALL TAKE ALL STEPS REQUIRED TO REDUCE OPERATIONS TO THE LEVEL
- 11 NECESSITATED BY THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 4. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DIRECTS THE GOVERNOR TO TAKE 12
- 13 ALL ACTION NECESSARY TO BALANCE THE 1981-1982 GENERAL FUND
- 14 BUDGET INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE REVISION OF THE
- 15 OFFICIAL REVENUE ESTIMATE AND THE ABATEMENT OF OTHER
- 16 APPROPRIATIONS.
- 17 SECTION 5. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
