AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 6 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 9 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 11 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 17 number and compensation of the deputies and all other 18 19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be determined, " transferring the State 20 21 general hospitals to the Department of Health. FURTHER 22 PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF THE STATE BOARD OF NURSE EXAMINERS. 23 24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 25 hereby enacts as follows: 26 Section 1. As much of section 202 as applies to the

Departments of Health and Public Welfare, act of April 9, 1929

(P.L.177, No.175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929," 1 amended July 20, 1974 (P.L.549, No.189) as to the Department of 2 3 Health, and September 28, 1976 (P.L.1048, No.211) as to the 4 Department of Public Welfare, is amended to read: 5 Section 202. (a) All personnel, allocations, appropriations, equipment, files, records, contracts, agreements, obligations, 17 18 and other material which are used, employed or expended in 19 connection with the powers, duties or functions transferred by 20 this act to the Department of Health are hereby transferred to 21 the Department of Health with the same force and effect as if 22 the appropriations had been made to and said items had been the property of the Department of Health in the first instance and 23 24 as if said contracts, agreements and obligations had been 25 incurred or entered into by said Department of Health. 26 (b) The personnel, appropriations, equipment and other items 27 and material transferred by this section shall include an appropriate portion of the general administrative, overhead and 28 29 supporting personnel, appropriations, equipment and other material of the agency and shall also include, where applicable,

- 1 Federal grants and funds and other benefits from any Federal
- 2 program.
- 3 (c) All personnel transferred pursuant to this act shall
- 4 retain any civil service employment status assigned to said
- 5 personnel.
- 6 Section 3. All rules, regulations and other actions of the
- 7 Department of Public Welfare relating to the State hospitals
- 8 shall remain in full force and effect until modified, repealed,
- 9 suspended, superseded or otherwise changed by appropriate action
- 10 of the Department of Health.
- 11 Section 4. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 12 as the "Public Welfare Code," is repealed insofar as it is
- 13 inconsistent herewith.
- 14 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
- 15 SECTION 1. SECTION 418, ACT OF APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
- 16 NO.175), KNOWN AS "THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE OF 1929," AMENDED

- 17 NOVEMBER 26, 1978 (P.L.1223, NO.292), IS AMENDED TO READ:
- 18 SECTION 418. STATE BOARD OF NURSE EXAMINERS.--THE STATE
- 19 BOARD OF NURSE EXAMINERS SHALL CONSIST OF THE COMMISSIONER OF
- 20 PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS, TWO MEMBERS WHO SHALL BE
- 21 PERSONS REPRESENTING THE PUBLIC AT LARGE, AND SEVEN MEMBERS,
- 22 FIVE OF WHOM SHALL BE REGISTERED NURSES, GRADUATED FROM SCHOOLS
- 23 OF NURSING WHERE PRACTICAL AND THEORETICAL INSTRUCTION IS GIVEN
- 24 IN GENERAL SURGICAL AND MEDICAL NURSING, AND TWO OF WHOM SHALL
- 25 BE LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES, AND WHO SHALL HAVE BEEN ENGAGED IN
- 26 NURSING IN THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA FOR AT LEAST FIVE
- 27 YEARS SINCE REGISTRATION.
- THE GOVERNOR SHALL, UPON THE EXPIRATION OF THE TERM OF OFFICE
- 29 OF ANY PROFESSIONAL MEMBER, APPOINT A PERSON, WITH THE ABOVE
- 30 SPECIFIED QUALIFICATIONS, [FROM TWO LISTS, EACH CONTAINING NOT

- LESS THAN TEN NAMES, ONE LIST SUBMITTED TO HIM BY THE BOARD OF
- 2 DIRECTORS OF THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE NURSES' ASSOCIATION AND THE
- 3 OTHER LIST SUBMITTED TO HIM BY THE NORTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA
- 4 LEAGUE OF LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSES,] FOR A TERM OF SIX YEARS,
- 5 AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIED BUT IN NO EVENT
- LONGER THAN SIX MONTHS BEYOND THE SIX-YEAR TERM. VACANCIES SHALL 6
- 7 BE FILLED IN LIKE MANNER.
- 8 FOUR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD SHALL CONSTITUTE A QUORUM, AND THE
- BOARD SHALL SELECT, FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS, A CHAIRMAN, AND
- 10 SHALL ELECT A SECRETARY WHO NEED NOT BE A MEMBER OF THE BOARD.
- 11 THE BOARD, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSIONER OF
- 12 PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS, SHALL ALSO APPOINT AND
- 13 FIX THE COMPENSATION OF ONE OR MORE STATE EDUCATIONAL ADVISORS
- 14 OF SCHOOLS OF NURSING, WHO SHALL HAVE THE SAME QUALIFICATIONS AS
- 15 THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.
- 16 THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD, OTHER THAN THE COMMISSIONER OF
- 17 PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS, SHALL RECEIVE THIRTY
- 18 DOLLARS PER DIEM, WHEN ACTUALLY ENGAGED IN THE TRANSACTION OF
- 19 OFFICIAL BUSINESS, AND THE SECRETARY SHALL RECEIVE SUCH
- 20 REASONABLE COMPENSATION AS SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE BOARD,
- 21 WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSIONER OF PROFESSIONAL AND
- 22 OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS.
- 23 SECTION 2. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
