AN ACT

Amending the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), entitled "An act relating to health care; prescribing the powers and duties of the Department of Health; establishing and 3 providing the powers and duties of the State Health Coordinating Council, health systems agencies and Health Care Policy Board in the Department of Health, and State Health 7 Facility Hearing Board in the Department of Justice; 8 providing for certification of need of health care providers and prescribing penalties, " providing for hemodialysis 9 services. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. The act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities Act, is amended by adding a 15 section to read: Section 806.1. Hemodialysis services. 16 17 (a) It is the intent of this section that a hemodialysis patient be fully informed about his or her therapy, including 18 19 the possibility of reuse of single use hemodialyzers, and that 20 the patient have full freedom of choice regarding the reuse of

such dialyzers.

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- 1 (b) The department shall adopt by April 1, 1984 regulations
- 2 <u>establishing such specific protocol for the reprocessing and</u>
- 3 reuse of disposable hemodialysis filters as it determines is
- 4 reasonably necessary for the protection of the health and safety
- 5 <u>of hemodialysis patients.</u>
- 6 (c) Every hemodialysis clinic or hospital providing
- 7 <u>hemodialysis services shall submit to the department for</u>
- 8 approval its protocol for dialyzer reprocessing and reuse within
- 9 three months after the effective date of the department's
- 10 protocol. The department shall approve each protocol which the
- 11 <u>department determines provides protection to hemodialysis</u>
- 12 patients which is equal to or greater than the protection
- 13 provided by the department's protocol. If a dialysis facility
- 14 does not submit a protocol to the department within three months
- 15 <u>after the department has established the protocol, such dialysis</u>
- 16 <u>facility shall automatically be subject to the department's</u>
- 17 protocol.
- 18 (d) The protocol shall include, but not be limited to, the
- 19 following:
- 20 (1) A patient when receiving dialysis treatment at a
- 21 <u>dialysis facility for the first time after July 1, 1984 shall</u>
- 22 execute a written consent for the reuse of disposable
- hemodialysis filters. The consent form shall be approved by
- 24 <u>the department and shall inform the patient of the risks and</u>
- 25 the possible benefits of reuse. The signature of the patient
- 26 <u>shall appear at the bottom of the form containing such</u>
- 27 information. The form shall be inserted in the patient's
- 28 <u>medical file at the dialysis facility.</u>
- 29 (2) The patient shall be informed that he or she is not
- 30 required to reuse a dialyzer.

- 1 (3) The patient may reject reuse of a dialyzer at any
- time and, upon rejection, shall be supplied a new dialyzer.
- 3 <u>(4) No patient shall be denied treatment at a dialysis</u>
- 4 <u>facility because he or she refuses to reuse a dialyzer.</u>
- 5 (5) Prior to a dialysis treatment, a patient who chooses
- 6 to reuse the filter shall be informed of how many times the
- 7 <u>filter has previously been used.</u>
- 8 (e) The protocol shall contain specific requirements and
- 9 standards for the reprocessing of such disposable dialyzers
- 10 which shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- 11 (1) Require that a dialysis facility utilize department
- 12 <u>approved methods in the rinsing, cleansing, sterilizing,</u>
- 13 <u>storing and labeling of such dialyzers.</u>
- 14 (2) Require that the dialysis facility utilize the most
- 15 <u>effective methods</u>, as determined by the department for
- detecting the presence of cleansing agents on the dialyzer
- 17 filter.
- 18 (3) Prohibit the reuse of a dialyzer when tests indicate
- 19 the presence of formaldehyde or other impurities following
- 20 cleansing.
- 21 (4) Establish specific standards for each type of
- 22 single-use dialyzer and prohibit reuse upon a specific
- 23 reduction of total capacity for each type of dialyzer.
- 24 (f) This section may be enforced by the department pursuant
- 25 to sections 811(1), 813, 814, 815, 817 and 818.
- 26 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
