## AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An
- 2 act concerning townships of the second class; and amending,
- revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto, providing for the appointment of independent 3
- 4
- auditors in lieu of elected auditors. 5
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. The act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), known as 8
- The Second Class Township Code, reenacted and amended July 10,
- 10 1947 (P.L.1481, No.567), is amended by adding a section to read:
- 11 Section 411.1. Appointed Auditors. -- (a) Any township may,
- 12 instead of electing three auditors as provided in section 411,
- provide, by ordinance, for the audit of its accounts by an 13
- 14 independent auditor who shall be a certified public accountant,
- 15 registered in Pennsylvania, a firm of certified public
- accountants so registered, or a competent public accountant, or 16
- a competent firm of public accountants. Where such an ordinance 17
- has been so adopted, an independent auditor shall be appointed, 18
- annually, by resolution before the close of the fiscal year, to 19

- 1 make an independent examination of all the accounts and
- 2 accounting records of the township for the fiscal year then
- 3 closing. Said appointment shall be made at least thirty days
- 4 prior to the close of the fiscal year. Such independent auditor
- 5 shall have and possess all the powers and perform all the duties
- 6 provided in this act for elected auditors. The compensation of
- 7 any such type of appointed auditor shall be fixed by the board
- 8 of supervisors. When an independent auditor is appointed as
- 9 herein provided, the office of elected auditor is hereby
- 10 <u>abolished</u>.
- (b) Whenever any township has heretofore provided by
- 12 ordinance, for the audit of its accounts by an appointed
- 13 <u>auditor</u>, <u>said township shall have the right at any time to</u>
- 14 repeal said ordinance; and thereupon, the office of appointed
- 15 auditor shall be abolished, and said township shall have the
- 16 <u>further right</u>, at the next municipal election following the
- 17 repeal of said ordinance, to elect three auditors, one for a
- 18 term of two years, one for a term of four years, and one for a
- 19 term of six years from the first Monday of January succeeding
- 20 <u>such election</u>, which auditors so elected shall succeed the
- 21 appointed auditor, and shall have and possess all the powers and
- 22 perform all the duties provided in this act for elected
- 23 auditors.
- 24 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
