AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for restitution
- 3 to victims of crimes.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 9763. Restitution as condition of parole.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- The sentencing judge shall, in sentencing
- 10 <u>a defendant for one or more of the offenses listed in subsection</u>
- 11 (b), provide that the defendant shall not be paroled unless full
- 12 restitution, or suitable arrangements therefor approved by the

- 1 court, has been made to every victim of the offense or, in cases
- 2 of homicide and kidnapping, to the family of the victim.
- 3 (b) Applicable offenses. -- This section shall apply to the
- 4 <u>following offenses and categories of offenses under Title 18</u>
- 5 (relating to crimes and offenses):
- 6 <u>Chapter 25 (relating to criminal homicide).</u>
- 7 <u>Section 2702 (relating to aggravated assault).</u>
- 8 <u>Section 2901 (relating to kidnapping).</u>
- 9 <u>Section 3121 (relating to rape).</u>
- 10 <u>Section 3301 (relating to arson and related offenses).</u>
- 11 <u>Section 3502 (relating to burglary).</u>
- 12 <u>Section 3701 (relating to robbery).</u>
- 13 <u>Subchapter B of Chapter 39 (relating to theft and related</u>
- offenses).
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
