HOUSE BILL No. 1026 Session of 1983

INTRODUCED BY PIEVSKY, MAY 24, 1983

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS, MAY 24, 1983

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of July 7, 1972 (P.L.743, No.176), entitled "An act 1 2 providing for the establishment and operation of Lincoln 3 University as an instrumentality of the Commonwealth to serve 4 as a State-related institution in the higher education system of the Commonwealth; providing for change of name; providing 5 б for the composition of the board of trustees; terms of 7 trustees, and the power and duties of such trustees; providing for preference to Pennsylvania residents in 8 9 tuition; authorizing appropriations in amounts to be fixed 10 annually by the General Assembly; providing for the auditing of accounts of expenditures from said appropriations; 11 providing for public support and capital improvements; 12 13 authorizing the issuance of bonds exempt from taxation within 14 the Commonwealth; requiring the President to make an annual 15 report of the operations of Lincoln University, " making appropriations to Lincoln University; providing for a basis 16 17 for payments of the appropriations; and providing a method of 18 accounting for the funds appropriated.

19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

20 hereby enacts as follows:

21 Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be

22 necessary, are hereby appropriated to the Trustees of Lincoln

23 University, for the fiscal year July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1984,

24 for the following purposes and amounts:

25 (1) For educational and general expenses..... \$4,272,000

1(2) For cost of student aid.....150,0002(3) For master's program in Human

3 Services..... 190,000

4 Section 2. Payments to Lincoln University on account of the
5 appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made on the basis
6 of costs during the fiscal period.

7 Section 3. (a) Payments to Lincoln University of the
8 appropriations provided in section 1 shall be made monthly
9 during the fiscal year.

10 (b) The monthly payments shall be made in accordance with 11 section 2 on the basis of estimated costs. The estimate of costs 12 shall be submitted by Lincoln University to the Secretary of 13 Education, the General Assembly and the State Treasurer not 14 later than 30 days prior to the date on which the payment is to 15 be made.

16 Section 4. (a) Lincoln University shall apply the moneys 17 appropriated by this act only for the purposes permitted in this 18 act and shall at all times maintain proper records showing the 19 application of the moneys. Not later than 120 days after the 20 close of the fiscal year to which this act relates, Lincoln 21 University shall file with the Secretary of Education, the 22 General Assembly and the Auditor General a statement setting 23 forth the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from 24 moneys appropriated by this act and other university accounts 25 during the fiscal year, as provided in section 2, used as a 26 basis for receipt of any appropriation during the fiscal year. 27 (b) The statement of expenditures and costs shall be reviewed by the Auditor General who has the right, in respect to 28 29 the moneys appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow 30 expenditures made for purposes not permitted by this act and to 19830H1026B1183 - 2 -

1 cause such sums to be recovered and paid by Lincoln University
2 to the State Treasurer. In respect to expenditures made by the
3 university from moneys other than those appropriated by this
4 act, the Auditor General has the right to review only and shall
5 file annually with the General Assembly any information
6 concerning these expenditures as the General Assembly or any of
7 its committees may require.

8 Section 5. A report shall be submitted to the Governor and 9 the Appropriations and Education Committees of the Senate and 10 House of Representatives and shall include data for all 11 programs. The report, to be submitted prior to September 1, 12 1984, shall cover the 12-month period beginning with the summer 13 term 1983 and shall include:

14 (1) The following counts and distributions for each term 15 during the period:

(i) The definitions and numbers of faculty members employed
full-time, of faculty members employed part-time, of full-time
students enrolled in graduate courses, of full-time students
enrolled in undergraduate courses, of part-time students
enrolled in graduate courses and of part-time students enrolled
in undergraduate courses.

(ii) The total numbers of undergraduate student credit hours, divided into lower division and upper division course levels and of graduate student credit hours divided into three course levels: master's, first professional and doctoral.

(iii) The number of different courses scheduled by level of
instruction and the number of sections of individual instruction
at each level of instruction.

29 (iv) The number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.
30 (2) For the summer term and the following academic year in
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total and for each two-digit Hegis category of instructional 1 2 programs in higher education as defined by the National Center 3 for Education Statistics, United States Department of Education, a classification of faculty members or other professional 4 5 employees by title including: professor, associate professor, assistant professor, instructor, lecturer, research associate, 6 librarian and academic administrator; faculty members or other 7 professional employees under each title to be subdivided by type 8 of assignment: teaching and nonteaching, with each set of 9 10 faculty members or other professional employees to be further 11 subdivided by type of employment: full-time or part-time and the following aggregates for each subdivided classification: 12 13 (i) The number of faculty and other professional employees

14 and their full-time equivalence in instructional and 15 noninstructional functions.

16 (ii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate classroom 17 courses and the sum of credits assigned to graduate classroom 18 courses taught, divided into lower division, upper division, 19 master's, first professional and doctoral course levels.

20 (iii) The sum of credits assigned to undergraduate 21 individual instruction courses and the sum of credits assigned 22 to graduate individual instruction courses taught, divided into 23 lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and 24 doctoral course levels.

25 (iv) The sum of undergraduate classroom student credit hours 26 and the sum of graduate classroom student credit hours 27 generated; divided into lower division, upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course levels. 28 The sum of undergraduate individual instruction student 29 (v) 30 credit hours and the sum of graduate individual instruction 19830H1026B1183 - 4 -

student credit hours generated; divided into lower division,
 upper division, master's, first professional and doctoral course
 levels.

4 (vi) The total salary paid for instructional functions and
5 for noninstructional functions and the amount of this salary
6 paid for each of these functions from college or university
7 funds, Federal funds and other funds.

8 (3) For each term of the period covered for each faculty 9 member employed full-time identified by two-digit Hegis category 10 and title, the report shall contain an analysis of the average 11 hours per week spent in college or university-related activities, stating specifically hours spent in undergraduate 12 13 classroom contact and graduate classroom contact, hours spent in 14 preparation, hours spent in research and hours spent in public 15 service.

Section 6. (a) In addition to the requirements in section 5 relative to this appropriation, the report covering the 12-month period beginning with the summer term 1983 shall include for all programs of the university:

20 (1) The minimum number of credits required for a21 baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.

(2) The number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees,
first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded in 1981,
1982, 1983 and estimated 1984.

(b) The Lincoln University shall report its revenues and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with the "Higher Education Finance Manual of 1975."

29 Section 7. The Lincoln University shall provide such 30 information as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of 19830H1026B1183 - 5 - this act and in the form and manner as the Department of
 Education may prescribe.

3 Section 8. The Lincoln University shall report its revenues 4 and expenditures and present its financial statements required under the provisions of this act in accordance with generally 5 accepted accounting principles and procedures for educational 6 institutions as set forth in the "Higher Education Finance 7 8 Manual of 1975," with the exceptions set forth in the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State-9 Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1983-1984." Credits 10 11 granted for nontraditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong 12 learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof 13 shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and included under "Public Service." 14

Section 9. This act shall take effect July 1, 1983 or, if enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.

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
