## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), entitled, as reenacted and amended, "An act providing property tax or rent 3 rebate and inflation dividends to certain senior citizens, widows, widowers and permanently disabled persons with 5 limited incomes; establishing uniform standards and 6 qualifications for eligibility to receive rebates and 7 dividends; providing for transportation assistance grants and grants to area agencies on aging for services to older 9 persons; and imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue," 10 establishing a pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision 11 assistance program for the elderly.
- 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- 14 Section 1. The title and section 2 of the act of March 11,
- 15 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), known as the Senior Citizens Rebate and
- 16 Assistance Act, reenacted and amended June 16, 1975 (P.L.7,
- 17 No.4) and amended March 10, 1982 (P.L.177, No.56), are amended
- 18 to read:

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- 2 Providing property tax or rent rebate and inflation dividends to
- 3 certain senior citizens, widows, widowers and permanently
- 4 disabled persons with limited incomes; establishing uniform
- 5 standards and qualifications for eligibility to receive
- 6 rebates and dividends; providing for transportation
- 7 assistance grants and grants to area agencies on aging for
- 8 services to older persons; establishing a pharmaceutical,
- 9 <u>dental</u>, <u>hearing aid and vision assistance program for the</u>
- 10 <u>elderly;</u> and imposing duties upon the Department of Revenue
- and the Department of Aging.
- 12 Section 2. Declaration of Policy. -- (a) In recognition of
- 13 the severe economic plight of certain senior citizens, widows,
- 14 widowers and permanently disabled persons who are real property
- 15 owners or renters with fixed and limited incomes who are faced
- 16 with rising living costs and constantly increasing tax and
- 17 inflation cost burdens which threaten their homesteads and self-
- 18 sufficiency, the General Assembly, pursuant to the mandates of
- 19 the Constitutional Convention of 1968, considers it to be a
- 20 matter of sound public policy to make special provisions for
- 21 property tax rebates or rent rebates in lieu of property taxes
- 22 and inflation dividends to that class of senior citizens,
- 23 widows, widowers and permanently disabled persons who are real
- 24 property taxpayers or renters who are without adequate means of
- 25 support to enable them to remain in peaceable possession of
- 26 their homes and relieving their economic burden and to provide
- 27 transportation assistance grants and to provide grants to area
- 28 agencies on aging for services to older persons.
- 29 (b) In further recognition of the severe economic plight of
- 30 certain senior citizens with fixed and limited incomes who are

- 1 faced with rising pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision
- 2 costs, the General Assembly, pursuant to the mandates of the
- 3 Constitutional Convention of 1968, considers it to be a matter
- 4 of sound public policy to make special provisions for
- 5 pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision assistance
- 6 benefits to that class of senior citizens who are without
- 7 <u>adequate means to pay for all or a portion of such costs.</u>
- 8 Section 2. Section 3(8) of the act, amended December 21,
- 9 1979 (P.L.570, No.131), is amended and clauses are added to
- 10 read:
- 11 Section 3. Definitions.--As used in this act:
- 12 \* \* \*
- 13 (8) "Department" means the Department of Revenue except in
- 14 the case of the Pharmaceutical, Dental, Hearing Aid and Vision
- 15 Assistance Program for the elderly where "department" shall mean
- 16 the Department of Aging.
- 17 \* \* \*
- 18 (10) "Pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision
- 19 assistance claimant" means any resident of the Commonwealth
- 20 <u>sixty-five years of age and over, whose annual income is less</u>
- 21 than the maximum annual income, and who is not otherwise
- 22 qualified for public assistance under the act of June 13, 1967
- 23 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the "Public Welfare Code."
- 24 (11) "Maximum <u>annual income" means annual income as</u>
- 25 <u>determined</u> by the Department of Aging. Such amount shall not
- 26 exceed eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) in the case of single
- 27 persons nor twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000) in the case of the
- 28 combined annual income of married persons.
- 29 (12) "Pharmacy" means any pharmacy licensed by the
- 30 <u>Commonwealth.</u>

- 1 (13) "Program" means the program of pharmaceutical, dental,
- 2 <u>hearing aid and vision assistance for the aging as established</u>
- 3 by this act.
- 4 (14) "Prescription drugs" means all legend drugs, insulin,
- 5 insulin syringes and insulin needles.
- 6 (15) "Reasonable cost" insofar as it relates to
- 7 prescriptions means the average wholesale price of the drug
- 8 product plus a dispensing fee which shall be two dollars fifty
- 9 cents (\$2.50).
- 10 (16) "Prescription drug, dental, hearing aid and vision
- 11 <u>expense</u>" means the reasonable cost incurred for prescription
- 12 drugs and dental, hearing aid and vision care for the personal
- 13 use of the pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision
- 14 assistance claimant.
- 15 Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 16 <u>Section 6.1. Pharmaceutical, Dental, Hearing Aid and Vision</u>
- 17 Assistance Program. -- There is hereby created a pharmaceutical,
- 18 dental, hearing aid and vision assistance program for the
- 19 elderly to be administered by the Department of Aging and funded
- 20 from the Lottery Fund.
- 21 (a) The program shall consist of payments to pharmacies,
- 22 dentists, hearing aid and vision care providers on behalf of
- 23 pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision assistance
- 24 claimants for the reasonable cost of a prescription, dental,
- 25 <u>hearing aid or vision care which exceeds one dollar (\$1)</u>
- 26 copayment per prescription or visit paid by each pharmaceutical,
- 27 dental, hearing aid and vision assistance claimant but the total
- 28 of all payments to any claimant in any one year shall not exceed
- 29 \$200. For the purpose of this act, with respect to
- 30 prescriptions, the pharmaceutical assistance claimant shall be

- 1 liable to pay the difference between the brand name drug and the
- 2 generically equivalent drug as approved under the provisions of
- 3 the act of November 24, 1976 (P.L.1163, No.259), referred to as
- 4 the Generic Equivalent Drug Law. The program shall be
- 5 <u>administered</u> by the Department of Aging, which shall promulgate
- 6 <u>rules and regulations necessary for administration of the</u>
- 7 program.
- 8 (b) Any otherwise eliqible pharmaceutical, dental, hearing
- 9 aid and vision assistance claimant whose prescription drug,
- 10 dental, hearing aid or vision care expenses are covered in part
- 11 by any other plan of assistance or insurance may be required to
- 12 receive reduced assistance under the provisions of this act at
- 13 the discretion of the Department of Aging.
- 14 (c) The Department of Aging shall establish a system for
- 15 <u>determining eliqibility including provisions for submission of</u>
- 16 proof of actual and anticipated income, and evidence of complete
- 17 or partial coverage of prescription drug, dental, hearing aid or
- 18 vision care expenses by any other assistance or insurance plans
- 19 and a system of payments to eliqible pharmacies, dentists,
- 20 <u>hearing aid and vision care providers. The Department of Aging</u>
- 21 may contract for the establishment of such a system, if such a
- 22 contract would be economically advantageous to the Commonwealth.
- 23 It is the intent of the General Assembly that any existing
- 24 methods and applications used to determine eligibility for
- 25 <u>similar existing programs be utilized to the extent possible in</u>
- 26 operationalizing this system.
- 27 (d) The Department of Aging shall adopt regulations relating
- 28 to the determination of eligibility of prospective
- 29 pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision assistance
- 30 claimants and the determination and elimination of program

- 1 abuse. The Department of Aging shall have the power to declare
- 2 <u>ineligible any pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision</u>
- 3 <u>assistance claimant who abuses or misuses the established</u>
- 4 pharmaceutical, dental, hearing aid and vision assistance
- 5 program.
- 6 (e) No person eligible for prescription, dental, hearing aid
- 7 or vision benefits under any other private, State or Federal
- 8 program of medical insurance or assistance which duplicates the
- 9 benefits available under this act shall be eligible hereunder,
- 10 to the extent of such duplication.
- 11 (f) Any person who submits a false or fraudulent claim under
- 12 this act, or who aids or abets another in the submission of a
- 13 <u>false or fraudulent claim, or who is eligible under a private,</u>
- 14 State or Federal program for prescription, dental, hearing aid
- 15 <u>or vision assistance and who claims or receives duplicative</u>
- 16 benefits hereunder or who otherwise violates any provision of
- 17 this act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.
- 18 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1983.
