AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, No.101), entitled, 2 as amended, "An act providing for the payment of death 3 benefits to the surviving spouse or children or parents of 4 firefighters, ambulance service or rescue squad members or law enforcement officers killed in the performance of their
- duties, "extending the provisions of the act to additional 6 persons.
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8
- hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 1 of the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424,
- 11 No.101), referred to as the Emergency and Law Enforcement
- 12 Personnel Death Benefits Act, amended October 16, 1981 (P.L.295,
- No.102), is amended to read: 13
- 14 Section 1. In the event a law enforcement officer, ambulance
- 15 service or rescue squad member or firefighter is killed [in the]
- or dies as the direct and proximate result of stress and strain 16
- 17 or diseases which arise out of the general performance of his
- duties, such political subdivision within 30 days from the date 18
- of death shall submit certification of such death to the 19
- Commonwealth. A volunteer firefighter shall be deemed to be 20

- 1 acting in the performance of his duties for the purposes of this
- 2 act going to or directly returning from a fire which the fire
- 3 company or fire department attended including travel from and
- 4 direct return to a firefighter's home, place of business or
- 5 other place where he or she shall have been when he or she
- 6 received the call or alarm or while participating in instruction
- 7 fire drills in which the fire department or fire company shall
- 8 have participated or while repairing or doing other work about
- 9 or on the fire apparatus or buildings and grounds of the fire
- 10 company or fire department upon the authorization of the chief
- 11 of the fire company or fire department or other person in charge
- 12 or while answering any emergency calls for any purpose or while
- 13 riding upon the fire apparatus which is owned or used by the
- 14 fire company or fire department or while performing any other
- 15 duties of such fire company or fire department as authorized by
- 16 the municipality or while performing duties imposed by section
- 17 15, act of April 27, 1927 (P.L.465, No.299), referred to as the
- 18 Fire and Panic Act. A volunteer ambulance service or rescue
- 19 squad member shall be deemed to be acting in the performance of
- 20 his duties for the purposes of this act going to or directly
- 21 returning from an emergency which the ambulance service or
- 22 rescue squad attended including travel from and direct return to
- 23 an ambulance service or rescue squad member's home, place of
- 24 business or other place where he or she shall have been when he
- 25 or she received the call or alarm or while participating in
- 26 drills in which the ambulance service or rescue squad shall have
- 27 participated or while repairing or doing other work about or on
- 28 any emergency vehicle or buildings and grounds of the ambulance
- 29 service or rescue squad upon the authorization of the chief of
- 30 the ambulance service or rescue squad or other person in charge

- 1 while answering any emergency calls for any purpose or while
- 2 riding upon any vehicles which are owned or used by the
- 3 ambulance service or rescue squad. Upon receipt of such
- 4 certification, the Commonwealth shall, from moneys payable out
- 5 of the General Fund, pay to the political subdivision the sum of
- 6 \$25,000. Within five days of receipt of said sum from the
- 7 Commonwealth, the political subdivision shall pay such sum as a
- 8 benefit to the surviving spouse, or if there is no surviving
- 9 spouse, to the minor children of the firefighter, ambulance
- 10 service or rescue squad member or law enforcement officer killed
- 11 in the performance of duty. When no spouse or minor children
- 12 survive, the benefit shall be paid to the parent or parents of
- 13 such firefighter, ambulance service or rescue squad member or
- 14 law enforcement officer.
- The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall pay out of the General
- 16 Fund to the surviving spouse, or, if there is no surviving
- 17 spouse, the minor children of a State police officer or other
- 18 law enforcement officer of the Commonwealth killed [in the] or
- 19 dying as the direct and proximate result of stress and strain or
- 20 <u>diseases which arise out of the general</u> performance of his
- 21 duties the sum of \$25,000. When no spouse or minor children
- 22 survive, the benefit shall be paid to the parent or parents of
- 23 such State police officer or other law enforcement officer of
- 24 the Commonwealth. The benefit shall be payable whether or not
- 25 the officer was killed within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 26 Section 2. This act shall be applicable to the deaths of all
- 27 firefighters, ambulance service or rescue squad members and law
- 28 enforcement personnel dying on and after January 1, 1976 as the
- 29 direct result of injuries sustained in the performance of their
- 30 duties, regardless of the date when such injuries occurred.

- 1 Section 3. (a) This act shall be retroactive to January 1,
- 2 1976.
- 3 (b) This act shall take effect immediately.
