## AN ACT

- 1 Making appropriations from a restricted revenue account within
- 2 the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the
- 3 Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. (a) The sum of \$7,970,000, or as much thereof as
- 7 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional
- 8 Licensure Augmentation Restricted Revenue Account within the
- 9 General Fund to the Department of State to augment the general
- 10 government appropriation for the operation of the Bureau of
- 11 Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal year July
- 12 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. No funds from this appropriation shall
- 13 be used to fund the operation of the State Registration Board of
- 14 Professional Engineers.
- 15 (b) The sum of \$525,000, or as much thereof as may be
- 16 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional
- 17 Licensure Augmentation Restricted Revenue Account within the
- 18 General Fund to the Department of State to augment the general
- 19 government appropriation for the operation of the State
- 20 Registration Board of Professional Engineers for the fiscal year
- 21 July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. Funds from this appropriation may
- 22 be used to fund test sites, travel expenses and consultant fees
- 23 at the discretion of the State Registration Board for
- 24 Professional Engineers.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if
- 26 enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.
