AN ACT

1 Making appropriations from a restricted revenue account within
2 the General Fund to the Department of State for use by the
3 Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. (a) The sum of \$7,970,000, or as much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional
8 Licensure Augmentation Restricted Revenue Account within the
9 General Fund to the Department of State to augment the general
10 government appropriation for the operation of the Bureau of
11 Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal year July
12 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. No funds from this appropriation shall
13 be used to fund the operation of the State Registration Board of
14 Professional Engineers.

15 (b) The sum of \$525,000, or as much thereof as may be
16 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Professional
17 Licensure Augmentation Restricted Revenue Account within the
18 General Fund to the Department of State to augment the general
19 government appropriation for the operation of the State
20 Registration Board of Professional Engineers for the fiscal year
21 July 1, 1984 to June 30, 1985. Funds from this appropriation may
22 be used to fund test sites, travel expenses and consultant fees
23 at the discretion of the State Registration Board for
24 Professional Engineers.

25 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 1984 or, if
26 enacted subsequent to that date, then immediately.
