## AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled
2	"An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the
3	executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
4	Executive Department thereof and the administrative
5	departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
6 7	including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
8	Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
o 9	authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
$11^{10}$	officers, and of the several administrative departments,
$12^{11}$	boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13	Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14	and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15	certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16	other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17	and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the
18	number and compensation of the deputies and all other
19	assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and
20	commissions shall be determined," providing for the
21	supervision and control of private prisons by the Office of
22	General Counsel; and making editorial changes.
23	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
24	hereby enacts as follows:
25	Section 1. Section 911 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
26	No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, amended July
27	16, 1968 (P.L.350, No.172), is amended to read:

1 Section 911. Penal and Correctional Institutions. -- The 2 [Department of Justice] Office of General Counsel shall have the 3 power and its duty shall be to supervise and control the State 4 Correctional Institution at Philadelphia, State Correctional Institution at Pittsburgh, State Correctional Institution at 5 Rockview, State Correctional Institution at Graterford, State 6 Correctional Institution at Huntingdon, State Correctional 7 8 Institution at Camp Hill, State Correctional Institution at Muncy, State Correctional Institution at Dallas and such State 9 10 regional jails, forestry camps and other State penal or 11 correctional off-institution grounds, facilities or installations which have been and which may be established by 12 13 law. The Office of General Counsel shall also have the power and its duty shall be to supervise the operation of private prisons 14 15 in this Commonwealth and shall, to the extent possible, apply 16 and enforce all regulations of the Bureau of Correction as set forth in 37 Pa. Code Chapters 91-95 (relating to Bureau of 17 18 Correction), and pertinent regulations hereafter adopted. As used in this section "private prison" means any facility for 19 20 prisoners which is not owned and operated by the United States, 21 the Commonwealth, a county or other municipality. 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
