1 2 3	Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, authorizing residential customers to refuse certain access charges.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 1502 of Title 66 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 1502. Discrimination in service.
9	(a) General ruleNo public utility shall, as to service,
10	make or grant any unreasonable preference or advantage to any
11	person, corporation, or municipal corporation, or subject any
12	person, corporation, or municipal corporation to any
13	unreasonable prejudice or disadvantage. No public utility shall
14	establish or maintain any unreasonable difference as to service,
15	either as between localities or as between classes of service,
16	but this section does not prohibit the establishment of
17	reasonable classifications of service. <u>Residential customers</u>
18	shall have the right to refuse access charges other than to the

1	utility's local exchange office or similar premises.
2	(b) DefinitionsAs used in this section:
3	"Access charge." Any tariff provision of a public utility
4	conveying or transmitting messages or communications by
5	telephone or domestic public land mobile radio service
6	including, but not limited to, point-to-point microwave radio
7	service for the public for compensation, with the sole purpose
8	or effect of recovery of the nontraffic sensitive costs of local
9	exchange facilities.
10	"Intrastate access." The embedded plant and facilities needed
11	to establish a connection between a customer to a
12	telecommunications network beginning at the demarcation point
13	between the customer's facilities and the utility's facilities,
14	but not including inside wiring or customer premises equipment,
15	and ending at the point at which the connection terminates at
16	the utility's local exchange office or similar premises.
17	"Nontraffic sensitive costs of local exchange facilities."
18	Embedded costs which are determined by the commission to be
19	directly and solely related to the provision of intrastate
20	access to any public utility providing switched telephone,
21	telegraph, domestic land mobile radio service or other
22	telecommunications service.
23	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
