A RESOLUTION

1 Requesting that the Labor Relations Committee of the House of 2 Representatives be directed to investigate and study the Department of Labor and Industry policy relating to job 3 4 retraining under the Unemployment Compensation Law. 5 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has the second highest unemployment rate among the ten most populous states; 6 7 and 8 WHEREAS, Many Pennsylvania residents are suffering as a 9 result of the high unemployment rate; and 10 WHEREAS, The interpretation of the Department of Labor and Industry as to denial of benefits is contrary to section 11 12 402(d)(1) of the Unemployment Compensation Law; and 13 WHEREAS, The Department of Labor and Industry has been using 14 a restrictive policy with regard to unemployment compensation 15 availability for suitable work requirements, particularly in the areas of job retraining and college attendance; therefore be it 16 17 RESOLVED, That the Labor Relations Committee of the House of 18 Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania be directed

1 to investigate and study the Department of Labor and Industry 2 policy relating to job retraining under the Unemployment 3 Compensation Law; and be it further

4 RESOLVED, That the Labor Relations Committee report its findings to the General Assembly as soon as possible. 5
