A RESOLUTION

1 Memorializing Congress to enact the Federal General Revenue 2 Sharing Program for the 1983-1984 fiscal year. 3 WHEREAS, The Federal General Revenue Sharing Program has 4 greatly assisted State and local governments in the funding of 5 necessary and needed governmental functions and programs; and 6 WHEREAS, This program allows Pennsylvania municipalities to 7 finance projects and services for their citizens and permits 8 municipal governments to apportion spending in relation to 9 individual community needs; and 10 WHEREAS, General Revenue Sharing accounts for about 14% of 11 local government budgets in Pennsylvania; and 12 WHEREAS, Property taxes or other taxes and user fees would have to be raised to offset any loss of General Revenue Sharing 13 funds; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Many local governments in Pennsylvania are at or

near their statutory taxation limits; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the Congress of the United States to swiftly enact the Federal General Revenue Sharing Program for the 1983-1984 fiscal year prior to the expiration of the current program on September 30, 1983, so that local governments may begin to compose their 1984 budgets; and be it further

8 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to 9 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each 10 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
