## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Disapproving the Department of Welfare regulation on medical
- 2 assistance Statewide ceilings for skilled nursing and
- 3 intermediate care facilities.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Welfare has proposed a
- 5 regulation relating to medical assistance Statewide ceilings for
- 6 skilled nursing and intermediate care facilities under the
- 7 authority of section 443.1(2) and (3) of the act of June 13,
- 8 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Senate Committee on Public Health and Welfare
- 10 and the House Committee on Public Health and Welfare recommended
- 11 disapproval of the proposed regulation to the Independent
- 12 Regulatory Review Commission under section 5(c)of the act of
- 13 June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review
- 14 Act; and
- WHEREAS, The committee received notice under section 6(c) of
- 16 the act that the commission approved the proposed regulation;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, The committee has determined that the proposed

- 1 regulation should be disapproved by the General Assembly and
- 2 notified the Department of Public Welfare of this determination;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, The committee reports this resolution under section
- 5 7(c) of the act for action by the General Assembly within 30
- 6 calendar days or ten legislative days, whichever is longer, from
- 7 the date of reporting this resolution; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 9 disapprove the proposed regulation of the Department of Public
- 10 Welfare on medical assistance Statewide ceilings for skilled
- 11 nursing and intermediate care facilities; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That notice of the final disposition of this
- 13 resolution be sent to the Department of Public Welfare and
- 14 published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
