## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and 2 3 brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and 4 changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, 6 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 11 12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective 13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 14 15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," 17 extending the hours of operation for certain holders of 18 Sunday sales permits. 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 20 hereby enacts as follows: 21 Section 1. Section 406(a)(3) of the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, amended December 17, 22 1982 (P.L.1390, No.319), is amended to read: 23 24 Section 406. Sales by Liquor Licensees; Restrictions. -- (a)

- 1 (3) Hotel and restaurant liquor licensees, airport
- 2 restaurant liquor licensees, municipal golf course restaurant
- 3 liquor licensees and privately-owned public golf course
- 4 restaurant licensees whose sales of food and nonalcoholic
- 5 beverages are equal to forty per centum or more of the combined
- 6 gross sales of both food and alcoholic beverages may sell liquor
- 7 and malt or brewed beverages on Sunday between the hours of [one
- 8 o'clock postmeridian] <u>eleven o'clock antemeridian</u> and two
- 9 o'clock antemeridian Monday upon purchase of a special annual
- 10 permit from the board at a fee of two hundred dollars (\$200.00)
- 11 per year, which shall be in addition to any other license fees.

- Section 2. Section 432(f) of the act, added June 24, 1982
- 14 (P.L.624, No.176), is amended to read:
- 15 Section 432. Malt and Brewed Beverages Retail Licenses.--
- 16 \* \* \*
- 17 (f) Hotel, eating places, or municipal golf course retail
- 18 dispenser licensees whose sales of food and nonalcoholic
- 19 beverages are equal to forty per centum (40%) or more of the
- 20 combined gross sales of both food and malt or brewed beverages
- 21 may sell malt or brewed beverages between the hours of [one
- 22 o'clock postmeridian] eleven o'clock antemeridian on Sunday and
- 23 two o'clock antemeridian on Monday upon purchase of a special
- 24 annual permit from the board at a fee of two hundred dollars
- 25 (\$200.00) per year, which shall be in addition to any other
- 26 license fees. Provided further, the holder of such special
- 27 annual permit may sell malt or brewed beverages after seven
- 28 o'clock antemeridian and until two o'clock antemeridian of the
- 29 following day, on any day on which a general, municipal, special
- 30 or primary election is being held.

1 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
