A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Soviet Union to permit free and unrestricted
- 2 immigration of Russian Jews from Russia to Israel.
- 3 WHEREAS, The Soviet Union has developed an immigration policy
- 4 which restricts the immigration of Russian Jews from Russia to
- 5 Israel; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The restrictions are so severe as to almost
- 7 completely deny this immigration; and
- 8 WHEREAS, A request to immigrate from Russia which is denied
- 9 usually results in the incarceration of the requester; and
- 10 WHEREAS, These practices are impractical for world politics,
- 11 ignoble to the human spirit and intolerable to persons who
- 12 believe in and seek to preserve the inherent free will of man;
- 13 therefore be it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge the Soviet Union to permit
- 15 free and unrestricted immigration of Russian Jews from Russia to
- 16 Israel; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be sent to the

- 1 Department of State of the United States for transmittal to the
- 2 Soviet Ambassador to the United States.
