44 ~~(1) Heat is a necessity of life, particularly in the~~

46 ~~(2) Rising home energy costs have significantly reduced~~
47 ~~the real purchasing power of low income individuals and~~

~~families in Pennsylvania.~~

~~(3) Low income individuals and families need assistance
to meet rising heating costs.~~

~~It is, therefore, the policy of the Commonwealth that energy
assistance shall be made available to low income individuals and
families as set forth herein.~~

~~Section 3. Definitions.~~

~~The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
context clearly indicates otherwise:~~

~~"Commitment." The obligation of moneys from an anticipated
appropriation to be made by the General Assembly. The commitment
is contingent upon the eventual passage of an appropriation and
no money shall be paid out until such an appropriation is
enacted.~~

~~"Department." The Department of Public Welfare of the
Commonwealth.~~

~~"Encumbrance." That portion of an appropriation which
represents a future expenditure pursuant to a contract, purchase
order or a known demonstrable bill, where an actual payment of
cash has not been made.~~

~~"Expenditure." That portion of an appropriation that
represents a payment of cash.~~

~~"Program." The Pennsylvania Supplemental Low Income Home
Energy Assistance Program established in section 4.~~

~~Section 4. Pennsylvania Supplemental Low Income Home Energy
Assistance Program.~~

~~(a) Creation. There is hereby created the Pennsylvania
Supplemental Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program to be
administered by the department.~~

~~(b) Operation. The program shall be administered and all funds disbursed in the same manner as the funds in the Federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance program administered by the department in accordance with Title XXVI of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 (Public Law 97-35, 95 Stat. 357), as amended, as it relates to the provision of:~~

~~(1) Cash benefit payments to eligible low income individuals and families to meet the cost of home energy.~~

~~(2) Energy crisis services to eligible low income individuals and families.~~

~~(3) Administrative costs associated with the provision of cash benefit payments and energy crisis services to eligible low income individuals and families.~~

~~(c) Eligibility. Eligibility criteria, benefits and benefit levels utilized for the program shall be consistent with the eligibility criteria, benefits and benefit levels utilized by the department for the Federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance program for the State fiscal year in which the funds are appropriated.~~

~~Section 5. Funding of the program.~~

~~(a) Use. General funds appropriated through this act shall be used solely to provide:~~

~~(1) Cash benefit payments to eligible low income individuals and families to meet the cost of home energy.~~

~~(2) Energy crisis services to eligible low income individuals and families.~~

~~(3) To cover the administrative costs related to the provision of cash benefit payments and energy crisis services to eligible low income individuals and families.~~

~~(b) Intent. It is the intent of the General Assembly that~~

1 ~~general funds annually appropriated for the program be held in~~
2 ~~reserve and utilized only after the total amount of Federal~~
3 ~~funds available for any one or all of the three purposes~~
4 ~~delineated in subsection (a) under the Federal Low Income Home~~
5 ~~Energy Assistance program in that same State fiscal year have~~
6 ~~been expended, encumbered or committed as certified by the~~
7 ~~Secretary of the Budget of the Commonwealth. Such certification~~
8 ~~shall be made so as to ensure that transition from the Federal~~
9 ~~Low Income Home Energy Assistance program to the Pennsylvania~~

22 AVAILABLE FROM THE JOBS STIMULUS BILL TO THE SEVERAL HEREINAFTER
23 NAMED AGENCIES OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH
24 FOR THE PURPOSES, AND UNDER THE RESTRICTIONS, FOR WHICH THE
25 FUNDS ARE PROVIDED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1984.

26 SECTION 108. BLOCK GRANTS.--(A) APPROPRIATION.--THE
27 FOLLOWING SUMS SET FORTH IN THIS ACT, OR AS MUCH THEREOF AS MAY
28 BE NECESSARY, ARE HEREBY SPECIFICALLY APPROPRIATED FROM THE
29 BLOCK GRANT (BG) FUNDS TO THE SEVERAL HEREINAFTER NAMED AGENCIES
30 OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH FOR THE

1 PURPOSES, AND UNDER THE RESTRICTIONS, FOR WHICH THE FUNDS ARE
2 PROVIDED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1984.

3 (B) SMALL COMMUNITIES DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT.--THE SMALL
4 COMMUNITIES DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (SCDBG) IS TO ASSIST SMALL
5 CITIES AND COMMUNITIES THAT HAVE A HIGH CONCENTRATION OF
6 IMPOVERISHED CITIZENS AND SUBSTANDARD HOUSING TO EXPAND THEIR
7 LOW AND MODERATE INCOME HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES AND TO MEET
8 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEEDS.

9 (C) COMMUNITY SERVICES BLOCK GRANT.--THE COMMUNITY SERVICES
10 BLOCK GRANT (CSBG) IS TO PROVIDE A RANGE OF SERVICES AND
11 ACTIVITIES HAVING A MEASURABLE AND POTENTIALLY MAJOR IMPACT ON
12 THE CAUSES OF POVERTY IN THE COMMUNITY OR THOSE AREAS OF THE
13 COMMUNITY WHERE POVERTY IS A PARTICULARLY ACUTE PROBLEM. IN
14 ADDITION, NEW FOCUS MAY BE PLACED ON THE UNEMPLOYED, BOTH OLD
15 AND NEW.

16 (D) EDUCATION CONSOLIDATION AND IMPROVEMENT BLOCK GRANT.--
17 THE EDUCATION CONSOLIDATION AND IMPROVEMENT BLOCK GRANT (ECIBG)
18 WILL BE USED FOR THE ADMINISTRATION AND PROVISION OF EDUCATION
19 PROGRAMS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE OMNIBUS
20 BUDGET RECONCILIATION ACT OF 1981.

21 (E) PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES BLOCK GRANT.--THE
22 PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND HEALTH SERVICES BLOCK GRANT (PHHSBG) IS
23 FOR THE PROVISION OF PREVENTIVE HEALTH AND OTHER HEALTH SERVICES

3 FOR PENSION INCREASES FOR ANNUITANTS SHALL REPLACE THE SIMILAR
4 APPROPRIATIONS CONTAINED IN THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF
5 1984.

6 (B) FEDERAL FUNDS.--ALL APPROPRIATIONS CONTAINED IN PART II
7 WHICH ARE THE SAME OR SIMILAR TO AN APPROPRIATION UNDER THE
8 GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 1984, SHALL REPLACE THAT
9 APPROPRIATION.

10 (C) LOTTERY FUNDS.--ALL APPROPRIATIONS CONTAINED IN PART III

17 SECTION 603. LAPSE DATE.--THE APPROPRIATIONS IN PART IV OF

19 CONTINUE UNTIL JUNE 30, 1986, AT WHICH TIME ANY REMAINING
20 BALANCE SHALL LAPSE INTO THE PENNSYLVANIA ECONOMIC
21 REVITALIZATION FUND.

22 SECTION 604. EFFECTIVE DATE.--THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT
23 IMMEDIATELY.
