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       The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
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   hereby enacts as follows:
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    Section 1. Short title.
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       This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania
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    Supplemental Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program.
    Section 2. Legislative findings and declaration of policy.
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       The General Assembly finds and declares that:
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            (1) Heat is a necessity of life, particularly in the
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       winter.
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            (2) Rising home energy costs have significantly reduced
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       the real purchasing power of low income individuals and
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- 1 families in Pennsylvania.
- 2 (3) Low income individuals and families need assistance
- 3 to meet rising heating costs.
- 4 It is, therefore, the policy of the Commonwealth that energy
- 5 assistance shall be made available to low income individuals and
- 6 families as set forth herein.
- 7 Section 3. Definitions.
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 9 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 11 "Commitment." The obligation of moneys from an anticipated
- 12 appropriation to be made by the General Assembly. The commitment
- 13 is contingent upon the eventual passage of an appropriation and
- 14 no money shall be paid out until such an appropriation is
- 15 enacted.
- 16 "Department." The Department of Public Welfare of the
- 17 Commonwealth.
- 18 "Encumbrance." That portion of an appropriation which
- 19 represents a future expenditure pursuant to a contract, purchase
- 20 order or a known demonstrable bill, where an actual payment of
- 21 cash has not been made.
- 22 "Expenditure." That portion of an appropriation that
- 23 represents a payment of cash.
- 24 "Program." The Pennsylvania Supplemental Low Income Home
- 25 Energy Assistance Program established in section 4.
- 26 Section 4. Pennsylvania Supplemental Low Income Home Energy
- 27 Assistance Program.
- 28 (a) Creation. There is hereby created the Pennsylvania
- 29 Supplemental Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program to be
- 30 administered by the department.

- 1 (b) Operation. The program shall be administered and all
- 2 funds disbursed in the same manner as the funds in the Federal
- 3 Low Income Home Energy Assistance program administered by the
- 4 department in accordance with Title XXVI of the Omnibus Budget
- 5 Reconciliation Act of 1981 (Public Law 97-35, 95 Stat. 357), as
- 6 amended, as it relates to the provision of:
- 7 (1) Cash benefit payments to eligible low income
- 8 individuals and families to meet the cost of home energy.
- 9 (2) Energy crisis services to eliqible low income
- 10 <u>individuals and families.</u>
- 11 (3) Administrative costs associated with the provision
- of cash benefit payments and energy crisis services to
- 13 eligible low income individuals and families.
- 14 (c) Eligibility. Eligibility criteria, benefits and benefit
- 15 levels utilized for the program shall be consistent with the
- 16 eligibility criteria, benefits and benefit levels utilized by
- 17 the department for the Federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance
- 18 program for the State fiscal year in which the funds are
- 19 appropriated.
- 20 Section 5. Funding of the program.
- 21 (a) Use. General funds appropriated through this act shall
- 22 be used solely to provide:
- 23 (1) Cash benefit payments to eligible low income
- 24 individuals and families to meet the cost of home energy.
- 25 (2) Energy crisis services to eligible low income
- 26 <u>individuals and families</u>.
- 27 (3) To cover the administrative costs related to the
- 28 provision of cash benefit payments and energy crisis services
- 29 to eligible low income individuals and families.
- 30 (b) Intent. It is the intent of the General Assembly that

- 1 general funds annually appropriated for the program be held in
- 2 reserve and utilized only after the total amount of Federal
- 3 funds available for any one or all of the three purposes
- 4 delineated in subsection (a) under the Federal Low Income Home
- 5 Energy Assistance program in that same State fiscal year have
- 6 been expended, encumbered or committed as certified by the
- 7 Secretary of the Budget of the Commonwealth. Such certification
- 8 shall be made so as to ensure that transition from the Federal
- 9 Low Income Home Energy Assistance program to the Pennsylvania
- 10 program does not result in the interruption of eligibility
- 11 determination or the delay of benefit payments.
- 12 (c) Specific appropriation. The sum of \$25,000,000, or as
- 13 much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from
- 14 the General Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 1984, to June 30,
- 15 1985, to carry out the provisions of this act.
- 16 (d) Future appropriations. Any general funds provided for
- 17 the program in subsequent fiscal years shall be appropriated in
- 18 the General Appropriation Acts for those fiscal years in an
- 19 amount deemed appropriate by the General Assembly.
- 20 Section 6. Effective date.
- 21 This act shall take effect immediately.

- 6 IMPOVERISHED CITIZENS AND SUBSTANDARD HOUSING TO EXPAND THEIR
- 7 LOW AND MODERATE INCOME HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES AND TO MEET
- 8 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEEDS.
- 9 (C) COMMUNITY SERVICES BLOCK GRANT. -- THE COMMUNITY SERVICES
- 10 BLOCK GRANT (CSBG) IS TO PROVIDE A RANGE OF SERVICES AND
- 11 ACTIVITIES HAVING A MEASURABLE AND POTENTIALLY MAJOR IMPACT ON
- 12 THE CAUSES OF POVERTY IN THE COMMUNITY OR THOSE AREAS OF THE
- 13 COMMUNITY WHERE POVERTY IS A PARTICULARLY ACUTE PROBLEM. IN
- 14 ADDITION, NEW FOCUS MAY BE PLACED ON THE UNEMPLOYED, BOTH OLD
- 15 AND NEW.
