## AN ACT

- Amending the act of January 25, 1966 (1965 P.L.1546, No.541),
- 2 entitled "An act providing scholarships and providing funds
- 3 to secure Federal funds for qualified students of the
- 4 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who need financial assistance to
- 5 attend postsecondary institutions of higher learning, making
- 6 an appropriation, and providing for the administration of
- 7 this act, providing for grants for part-time students.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 4(a)(4) of the act of January 25, 1966
- 11 (1965 P.L.1546, No.541), entitled "An act providing scholarships
- 12 and providing funds to secure Federal funds for qualified
- 13 students of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who need financial
- 14 assistance to attend postsecondary institutions of higher
- 15 learning, making an appropriation, and providing for the
- 16 administration of this act, " amended December 18, 1969 (P.L.383,
- 17 No.169), is amended to read:
- 18 Section 4. (a) Any student is eligible for consideration

- 1 for a State scholarship providing:
- 2 \* \* \*
- 3 (4) He is enrolled, or will be enrolled in the fall semester
- 4 immediately following his secondary school graduation or his
- 5 date of application, as a full-time student or as a part-time
- 6 student at an institution of higher learning: Provided, however,
- 7 That failure to enroll in the fall semester immediately
- 8 following secondary school graduation shall not render
- 9 ineligible a student who entered service in the military forces
- 10 of the United States, the Peace Corps or Volunteers in Service
- 11 to America, during the fall semester immediately following his
- 12 secondary school graduation;
- 13 \* \* \*
- 14 Section 2. Section 7(a) of the act, amended May 4, 1977
- 15 (P.L.1, No.1), is amended to read:
- 16 Section 7. (a) All scholarship awards will be based on the
- 17 applicant's financial need, the minimum scholarship award being
- 18 one hundred dollars (\$100) per academic year, the maximum
- 19 scholarship shall not exceed one thousand five hundred dollars
- 20 (\$1,500) per academic year for full-time students or one
- 21 thousand dollars (\$1,000) for part-time students and the maximum
- 22 scholarship award shall be established annually by the board of
- 23 directors of the agency at a maximum level not to exceed one
- 24 thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) so as to keep
- 25 expenditures within the funds available through reenactment of
- 26 appropriations as provided for under the act of March 28, 1974
- 27 (P.L.228, No.50), relating to the forward funding of PHEAA grant
- 28 program and/or from funds appropriated or made available from
- 29 State, Federal or other sources for grants during any fiscal
- 30 year. Scholarship awards for part-time students, in addition to

- 1 being based on financial need, shall also be calculated in
- 2 proportion to the credit load the student is carrying, in such
- 3 <u>manner as the agency may determine</u>.

- 5 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
