AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for prohibited
- 3 offensive weapons.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 908(d) of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 908. Prohibited offensive weapons.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (d) Exemptions. -- The use and possession of blackjacks by the
- 11 following persons in the course of their duties are exempt from
- 12 this section:
- 13 (1) Police officers, as defined by and who meet the
- 14 requirements of the act of June 18, 1974 (P.L.359, No.120),
- referred to as the Municipal Police Education and Training
- 16 Law.
- 17 (2) Police officers of first class cities who have

- 1 successfully completed training which is substantially
- 2 equivalent to the program under the Municipal Police
- 3 Education and Training Law.
- 4 (3) Pennsylvania State Police officers.
- 5 (4) Sheriffs [and], deputy sheriffs and campus police of
- 6 the various counties who have satisfactorily met the
- 7 requirements of the Municipal Police Education and Training
- 8 Law.
- 9 (5) Police officers employed by the Commonwealth who
- 10 have satisfactorily met the requirements of the Municipal
- 11 Police Education and Training Law.
- 12 (6) Deputy sheriffs with adequate training as determined
- by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency.
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
