AN ACT

- Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

- hereby enacts as follows: 6
- 7 Section 1. Section 1503(c) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 8
- 9 § 1503. Persons ineligible for licensing.
- 10
- (c) Junior driver's license. -- The department may issue a 11
- 12 junior driver's license only to a person 16 or 17 years of age
- who has successfully completed a standardized driver training 13
- course approved by the Department of Education under rules and 14
- 15 regulations adopted by the department and subject to the
- provisions of this section. A junior driver's license shall 16
- automatically become a regular driver's license when the 17
- 18 licensee attains 18 years of age.

- 1 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), no licensed
 2 junior driver shall drive a vehicle upon a public highway
 3 between 12 midnight and 5 a.m. unless accompanied by a spouse
 4 18 years of age or older, a parent or a person in loco
 5 parentis.
 - (2) A licensed junior driver conforming to the requirements of section 1507 (relating to application for driver's license or learner's permit by minor) may drive a vehicle upon a public highway between 12 midnight and 5 a.m. between their home and their activity or employment or in the course of their activity or employment if they are a member of a volunteer fire company authorized by the fire chief to engage in fighting fires, engaged in public or charitable service or employed and they are carrying an affidavit signed by their fire chief, supervisor or employer indicating the probable schedule of their activities. Upon termination of the junior driver's activity or employment, the junior licensee shall surrender the affidavit to the fire chief, supervisor or employer. If the junior licensee shall fail to surrender the affidavit, the employer, fire chief or supervisor shall immediately notify the Pennsylvania State Police.
 - (3) In addition to the other provisions of this title relating to the suspension or revocation of operating privileges, in the event that a licensed junior driver is involved in an accident for which they are partially or fully responsible in the opinion of the department or is convicted of any violation of this title, the department may suspend the operating privileges of such person until the person attains 18 years of age or for a period of time not exceeding
