AN ACT

1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
2 Statutes, further providing for the processing fee in lieu of
3 the registration fee.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 1901(c) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:

8 § 1901. Exemption of entities and vehicles from fees.

9 * * *

10 (c) Processing fee in lieu of registration fee.--No
11 registration fee shall be charged for vehicles registered by any
12 of the following but the department shall charge a fee of \$10 to
13 cover the costs of processing for issuing or renewing the
14 registration:

- 15 (1) Hospital.
16 (2) Humane society.
17 (3) Nonprofit youth center.
18 (4) American Red Cross.

1 (5) Church.

2 (6) Girl Scouts of America.

3 (7) Boy Scouts of America.

4 (8) Salvation Army.

5 (9) Duly chartered posts of national veterans'

6 organizations.

7 (10) Young Men's Christian Association.

8 (11) Young Men's Hebrew Association.

9 (12) Young Women's Christian Association.

10 (13) Young Women's Hebrew Association.

11 (14) Jewish Community Center.

12 (15) Nonprofit corporations of musical marching groups

13 of youths.

14 (16) Any person who is retired and receiving social

15 security or other pension and whose total income does not

16 exceed [\$9,000] \$11,999 per year. Unless the retired person

17 is physically or mentally incapable of driving the vehicle,

18 the retired person shall be the principal driver of the

19 vehicle but may from time to time authorize another person to

20 drive the vehicle in his or her stead. The total amount of

21 money which is annually lost due to benefits received by

22 those individuals who are eligible for or are receiving

23 benefits pursuant to the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104,

24 No.3), known as the "Senior Citizens Rebate and Assistance

25 Act," by the Department of Transportation by operation of

26 this paragraph based on the difference between the normal

27 registration fee and the processing fee shall be appropriated

28 from the Lottery Fund to the Motor License Fund. The Governor

29 is hereby authorized to annually transfer from the Lottery

30 Fund the necessary amount of money to reimburse the Motor

1 License Fund pursuant to this paragraph. Such money is hereby
2 specifically appropriated to the Motor License Fund to be
3 expended by the Department of Transportation with the
4 approval of the Governor.

5 (17) Any veteran who lost a limb or eye or who became
6 partially paralyzed while serving in the armed forces of the
7 United States.

8 (18) A person who, as a member of the armed forces of
9 the United States, was captured by the enemy during World War
10 I, World War II, the Korean Emergency, the Vietnam Conflict
11 or in a future armed conflict for which the Department of
12 Defense authorizes a campaign medal.

13 (19) Any person who has been awarded the Congressional
14 Medal of Honor.

15 * * *

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
