## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, increasing the income eligibility level for the
- 3 emission inspection credit.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 4706(h) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 4706. Prohibition on expenditures for emission inspection
- 9 program.

- 11 (h) Definitions.--As used in this section the following
- 12 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 13 subsection:
- 14 "Dependent." A natural person who derives more than one-half
- 15 of his total support during the entire taxable year from another
- 16 individual. Any individual who shall be a dependent shall not be
- 17 eligible to claim the credit authorized by subsection (f).
- 18 "Qualified person or persons." A natural person or persons

- 1 who is an unmarried individual or surviving spouse who is not a
- 2 dependent of another individual with income as defined in
- 3 section 301 of the act of March 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as
- 4 the Tax Reform Code of 1971, for the prior calendar year not
- 5 exceeding [\$9,000] <u>\$15,000</u>; or who are a husband and wife filing
- 6 the personal income tax return separately or jointly with a
- 7 combined income as defined in section 301 of the Tax Reform Code
- 8 of 1971, for the prior calendar year not exceeding [\$9,000]
- 9 \$15,000.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
