A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 Directing the Joint State Government Commission to appoint a
2 task force to study the issue of interstate banking.

3 WHEREAS, Several states have entered into regional interstate
4 banking compacts which have potential impact not only on those
5 states but also on the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

6 WHEREAS, Several states proximate to Pennsylvania are
7 considering interstate banking legislation and failure on the
8 part of this Commonwealth to consider this issue could lead to
9 Pennsylvania's isolation from such compacts; and

10 WHEREAS, The United States Congress is also considering the
11 feasibility of interstate banking; and

12 WHEREAS, There is a diversity of opinion as to the impact of
13 interstate banking on the financial institutions and consumers
14 of Pennsylvania; therefore be it

15 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
16 direct the Joint State Government Commission to appoint a task
17 force to conduct a thorough study of the issue of interstate

1 banking, such task force to be appointed within 60 days of the
2 adoption of this resolution; and be it further

3 RESOLVED, That the task force shall meet within 30 days of
4 its establishment for the purpose of selecting a chairman from
5 its membership. Thereafter, the task force shall meet as
6 necessary at the call of the chairman; and be it further

7 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission report
8 the findings of its task force, together with recommendations
9 for appropriate legislation, as soon as possible.
