10	An action to recover damages for injuries to the person as a	
11	result of child abuse may be commenced at any time before the	
12	victim reaches 18 years of age or as set forth elsewhere in this

14	§ 5555. Victim of child abuse.	
15	A prosecution for any offense relating to child abuse may be	
16	commenced at any time before the victim reaches 18 years of age	
17	or as set forth elsewhere in this subchapter.

- 1 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED BY SECTION 5553(E) (RELATING TO
- 2 DISPOSITION OF PROCEEDINGS WITHIN TWO YEARS), THE PERIOD OF
- 3 LIMITATION DOES NOT RUN DURING ANY TIME WHEN:
- (1) THE ACCUSED IS CONTINUOUSLY ABSENT FROM THIS 4
- 5 COMMONWEALTH OR HAS NO REASONABLY ASCERTAINABLE PLACE OF
- 6 ABODE OR WORK WITHIN THIS COMMONWEALTH; [OR]
- 7 (2) A PROSECUTION AGAINST THE ACCUSED FOR THE SAME
- 8 CONDUCT IS PENDING IN THIS COMMONWEALTH[.]; OR
- 9 (3) A CHILD IS UNDER 18 YEARS OF AGE, WHERE THE CRIME
- 10 INVOLVES INJURIES TO THE PERSON OF THE CHILD CAUSED BY THE
- 11 WRONGFUL ACT, OR NEGLECT, OR UNLAWFUL VIOLENCE, OR NEGLIGENCE
- 12 OF THE CHILD'S PARENTS OR BY A PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THE
- 13 CHILD'S WELFARE, OR ANY INDIVIDUAL RESIDING IN THE SAME HOME
- 14 AS THE CHILD, OR A PARAMOUR OF THE CHILD'S PARENT.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
