1 2 3	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further defining "firearm"; and providing for a sportsman's firearm permit.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 6102 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
7	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 6102. Definitions.
9	Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
10	provisions of this subchapter which are applicable to specific
11	provisions of this subchapter, the following words and phrases,
12	when used in this subchapter shall have, unless the context
13	clearly indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this
14	section:

1 ["Firearm." Any pistol or revolver with a barrel less than 2 12 inches, any shotgun with a barrel less than 24 inches, or any 3 rifle with a barrel less than 15 inches.]

<u>"County treasurer." The county treasurer or, in home rule or</u>
<u>optional plan counties, the person whose duties encompass those</u>
of a county treasurer.

7 "Crime of violence." Any of the following crimes, or an 8 attempt to commit any of the same, namely: murder, rape, 9 aggravated assault, robbery, burglary, entering a building with 10 intent to commit a crime therein, and kidnapping.

11 <u>"Firearm." Any pistol or revolver with a barrel less than 12</u>
12 <u>inches, any shotgun with a barrel less than 18 inches, or any</u>

13 rifle with a barrel less than 16 inches, or any pistol,

14 revolver, rifle or shotgun with an overall length of less than

15 <u>26 inches. The barrel length of a firearm shall be determined by</u>

16 measuring from the muzzle of the barrel to the face of the

17 closed action, bolt or cylinder, whichever is applicable.

18 Section 2. Sections 6106(c) and 6120 of Title 18 are amended 19 to read:

20 § 6106. Firearms not to be carried without a license.

22 (c) [Registration required in connection with field or stream exemptions. -- Before any exemption shall be granted under 23 24 subsection (b)(9) or (b)(10) to any person licensed to hunt, 25 take furbearers or fish or who desires to train dogs, such 26 person shall at the time of securing his hunting, furtaking or 27 fishing license or any time after any such license has issued, register with the county treasurer the make of the firearm he 28 29 desires to carry, and the caliber and number thereof, on a blank 30 to be furnished by the Pennsylvania State Police. 1 registration shall be delivered to the person registering such firearm, and a copy thereof shall be forwarded by the county 2 3 treasurer to the Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police. 4 As of January 1, 1972, the county treasurer shall be entitled to collect a fee of 50 cents for each such registration of a 5 6 firearm which fee shall be paid to the county. The registration of a firearm, as provided in this subsection, shall be good only 7 8 for the year for which the hunting, furtaking or fishing license 9 in connection with which it is granted, is issued.] Sportsman's 10 firearm permit.--

11 (1) Before any exception shall be granted under 12 paragraph (b)(9) or (10) of this section to any person 18 13 years of age or older licensed to hunt, trap or fish or who desires to train dogs for hunting, such person shall, at the 14 time of securing his hunting, furtaking or fishing license or 15 16 any time after such license has been issued, secure a sportsman's firearm permit from the county treasurer. The 17 18 sportsman's firearm permit shall be issued immediately and be valid throughout this Commonwealth for a period of five years 19 20 from the date of issue for any legal firearm, when carried in 21 conjunction with a valid hunting, furtaking or fishing 22 license. The sportsman's firearm permit shall be in 23 triplicate on a form to be furnished by the Pennsylvania 24 State Police. The original permit shall be delivered to the person, and the first copy thereof, within seven days, shall 25 be forwarded to the Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State 26 27 Police by the county treasurer. The second copy shall be 28 retained by the county treasurer for a period of two years 29 from the date of expiration. 1	permit issued, which shall include the cost of any official
2	form. The Pennsylvania State Police may recover from the
3	county treasurer the cost of any such form, but may not
4	charge more than \$1 for each official permit form furnished
5	to the county treasurer.
6	(2) Any person who sells or attempts to sell a
7	sportsman's firearm permit for a fee in excess of that amount
8	fixed under this subsection commits a summary offense.

10	§ 6120. Limitation on municipal regulation of firearms and
11	ammunition.
12	(a) General ruleNo county, municipality or township may
13	in any manner regulate the lawful ownership, possession,
14	transfer or transportation of firearms, ammunition or ammunition
15	components when carried or transported for purposes not
16	prohibited by the laws of this Commonwealth.
17	(b) DefinitionFor the purposes of this section the term
18	"firearms" shall not include "air rifles" as defined in section
19	6304 (relating to sale and use of air rifles).
20	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
