Reenacting and amending the act of July 2, 1984 (P.L.553, 2 No.110), entitled "An act establishing a program within the Department of Commerce to provide grants to engineering 3 degree granting schools to assist in the acquisition of new 5 engineering equipment or the upgrading of existing 6 engineering equipment that is necessary to provide students 7 with the courses required to obtain a degree in engineering; and making a nonlapsing appropriation, " extending the expiration date of the act. 9 AMENDING THE ACT OF JULY 3, 1987 (P.L.459, NO.9A), ENTITLED "AN 10 11 ACT TO PROVIDE FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE 12 EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH, THE PUBLIC DEBT AND FOR THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR 13 THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1987, TO JUNE 30, 1988, AND FOR THE 14 PAYMENT OF BILLS INCURRED AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE 15 16 OF THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1987; TO PROVIDE 17 APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE LOTTERY FUND, THE PENNSYLVANIA ECONOMIC REVITALIZATION FUND AND THE ENERGY CONSERVATION AND 18 19 ASSISTANCE FUND TO THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT; TO PROVIDE FOR 20 THE APPROPRIATION OF FEDERAL FUNDS TO THE EXECUTIVE AND 21 JUDICIAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND FOR THE 22 ESTABLISHMENT OF RESTRICTED RECEIPTS ACCOUNTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 1987, TO JUNE 30, 1988, AND FOR THE PAYMENT OF 23 BILLS INCURRED AND REMAINING UNPAID AT THE CLOSE OF THE 24 25 FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1987; ITEMIZING APPROPRIATIONS 26 REQUIRED FROM THE MOTOR LICENSE FUND FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 27 1, 1987, TO JUNE 30, 1988, FOR THE PROPER OPERATION OF THE SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH AUTHORIZED TO SPEND 28 29 MOTOR LICENSE FUND MONEYS; AND TO FURTHER PROVIDE FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT AND 30 JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH, THE PUBLIC DEBT AND 31

- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The title of the act of July 2, 1984 (P.L.553,
- 10 No.110), known as the Engineering School Equipment Act, is
- 11 reenacted and amended to read:
- 12 AN ACT
- 13 Establishing a program within the Department of Commerce to
- 14 provide grants to engineering degree granting schools to
- 15 assist in the acquisition of new engineering equipment or the
- 16 upgrading of existing engineering equipment that is necessary
- 17 to provide students with the courses required to obtain a
- 18 degree in engineering[; and making a nonlapsing
- 19 appropriation].
- 20 Section 2. Sections 1 and 2 of the act are reenacted to
- 21 read:
- 22 Section 1. Short title.
- 23 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Engineering
- 24 School Equipment Act.
- 25 Section 2. Definitions.
- 26 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 27 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 28 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 29 "Board." The Board of the Ben Franklin Partnership Fund
- 30 provided for in section 448(n) of the act of April 9, 1929
- 31 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.
- 32 "Department." The Department of Commerce.

- 1 "Engineering degree granting school." An institution of
- 2 higher education which offers curriculum in engineering or
- 3 engineering technology which has been approved by the
- 4 Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology (ABET) and is
- 5 recognized as such by the State Registration Board for
- 6 Professional Engineers.
- 7 "Equipment." Basic instructional equipment of an engineering
- 8 nature used in the teaching of undergraduate or graduate
- 9 engineering or engineering technology.
- 10 "Full time equivalent engineering student." The enrollment
- 11 in baccalaureate and graduate programs of engineering schools
- 12 expressed in terms of full time students as determined by the
- 13 Department of Education.
- 14 Section 3. Section 3 of the act, amended July 9, 1986
- 15 (P.L.1210, No.105), is reenacted to read:
- 16 Section 3. Engineering equipment acquisition and upgrade.
- 17 (a) Program. There is established within the department a
- 18 program to provide grants to engineering degree granting
- 19 schools. The program shall be administered by the board. Funds
- 20 provided through this program shall be used exclusively for the
- 21 acquisition of new engineering equipment and the upgrading of
- 22 existing engineering equipment that is necessary to provide
- 23 students with the courses required to obtain a baccalaureate or
- 24 graduate engineering degree. The board shall:
- 25 (1) Promulgate such policies, develop such forms and
- 26 <u>institute such procedures as may be necessary to implement</u>
- 27 this act.
- 28 (2) Allocate to each engineering school funds for which
- 29 <u>it is eligible under this act.</u>
- 30 (3) Approve or disapprove any request for expenditures

- 1 for the purchase or upgrading of equipment.
- 2 (4) Require such information and records from each
- 3 engineering school as it deems necessary.
- 4 (5) Request the Department of Education to certify to
- 5 the board the full time equivalent enrollment of
- 6 baccalaureate and graduate engineering students at each
- 7 engineering school in the most recent year for which data are
- 8 available.
- 9 (b) Allocation of funds. The funds provided for in this act
- 10 shall be allocated by the board for grants to the engineering
- 11 degree granting schools based on the ratio of full time
- 12 equivalent students enrolled in baccalaureate and graduate
- 13 engineering programs at each school to the total number of full-
- 14 time equivalent undergraduate and graduate engineering students
- 15 in the Commonwealth.
- 16 (c) Expenditure of funds. All grants made to engineering
- 17 degree granting schools shall be expended only for equipment. No
- 18 engineering school shall expend any grant funds on equipment
- 19 unless it also expends funds obtained from private sources on
- 20 that equipment. At least \$3 of private funds shall be required
- 21 for each \$1 of grant funds from this program. Grants made under
- 22 this act shall not be used to supplant existing Federal, State
- 23 or local funds for the acquisition or upgrading of engineering
- 24 equipment. As used in this subsection the term "private funds"
- 25 shall include funds obtained from corporate foundations.
- 26 (d) Distribution of unused funds. Any allocated funds which
- 27 have not been expended consistent with subsection (c) by June
- 28 30, 1986, shall be available for reallocation by the board.
- 29 Section 4. Section 4 of the act is reenacted to read:
- 30 Section 4. Indicators of program impact.

- 1 The department shall report to the General Assembly by June
- 2 30, 1987, on the impact of the program, including the types of
- 3 equipment funded and the amount of private sector matching funds
- 4 generated. All recipients of grants under this act shall provide
- 5 information requested by the department for the purposes of this
- 6 report.
