AN ACT

- 1 Appropriating money from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of
- 2 Commerce for various projects throughout this Commonwealth
- 3 for fiscal year 1988-1989.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The sums set forth in this act, or as much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically
- 8 appropriated from the Sunny Day Fund to the Department of
- 9 Commerce for the fiscal year July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, for
- 10 the projects listed to enhance economic development and the
- 11 creation of jobs in this Commonwealth in accordance with the
- 12 provisions of Chapter 1 of the act of July 1, 1985 (P.L.120,
- 13 No.32), known as the Sunny Day Fund Act.
- 14 Section 2. The following amounts are appropriated to the
- 15 Department of Commerce to induce companies to locate large
- 16 industrial, manufacturing or research and development
- 17 enterprises within this Commonwealth:

1	(1) For the purpose of making a loan to		
2	Epsilon Products, Incorporated, to locate a		
3	manufacturing facility in Marcus Hook, Delaware		
4	County. It is estimated that this project will		
5	create 200 new jobs within three years of		
6	operation.		
7	State appropriation	\$3,000,000	
8	(2) For the purpose of providing interest		
9	and/or principal guarantee to induce Shea		
10	Communications, Incorporated, or its affiliate		
11	to locate a printing facility in York County.		
12	It is estimated that this project will create		
13	500 new jobs within three years of operation.		
14	State appropriation	7,500,000	
15	(3) For the purpose of making a loan to		
16	Allegheny Ludlum, Incorporated, to assist in		
17	its acquisition of the USX Vandergrift facility		
18	in Westmoreland County. It is estimated that		
19	this project will create approximately 300 jobs		
20	within three years of operation.		
21	State appropriation	3,750,000	
22	(4) For the purpose of making a loan to		
23	Glass Adventures, Incorporated, or its		
24	affiliate, to locate a glass manufacturing		
25	facility in Washington County. It is estimated		
26	that this project will create approximately 500		
27	new jobs within three years of operation.		
28	State appropriation	6,000,000	
29	(5) For the purpose of making a loan to		
30	Aluglas of Pennsylvania, Incorporated, to		
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1	locate a manufacturing facility in Allegheny	
2	County. It is estimated that this project will	
3	create 367 jobs within three years of	
4	operation.	
5	State appropriation 5,500,000	
6	(6) For the purpose of making a loan to	
7	UNISYS to locate its corporate training	
8	facility in Montgomery County. It is expected	
9	that this project will create 400 300 new jobs <	
10	within three years of operation.	
11	State appropriation	
12	(7) For the purpose of making a loan to	
13	PPG Industries, Inc., to locate its Chemical	
14	Division Research and Development Group to	
15	Monroeville, Allegheny County. It is expected	
16	that this project will create 250 new jobs	
17	within three years of operation.	
18	State appropriation	
19	Section 3. It is the intent of the General Assembly that the	
20	appropriations in section 2 shall be loaned at an annual	
21	interest rate that in no case shall be less than the	
22	Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority's rate for the	
23	area in which the project is located and for a term that shall	
24	be the same as the term for an equivalent Pennsylvania	
25	Industrial Development Authority project. Private companies	
26	which receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to make the	
27	investment in the enterprise development as specified in section	
28	2 shall be liable for the repayment of all Sunny Day Fund	
29	moneys, including any accrued interest thereon and any penalties	
30	set by the Secretary of Commerce. Private companies which	

- 1 receive Sunny Day Fund assistance but fail to create the number
- 2 of jobs specified in the approved loan or other agreements with
- 3 the Commonwealth shall be liable for a penalty equal to an
- 4 increase in the interest charged to 2% greater than the current
- 5 prime interest rate for the remainder of the loan, unless the
- 6 penalty is waived by the Secretary of Commerce because the
- 7 failure is due to circumstances outside the control of the
- 8 private company. The Secretary of Commerce shall consult with
- 9 the chairmen of the Appropriations Committees of the Senate and
- 10 the House of Representatives prior to the establishment of
- 11 waiver of penalties.
- 12 Section 4. For a period equal to the term of assistance
- 13 provided each project approved under this act, the Department of
- 14 Commerce shall provide a written report on the status of each
- 15 project to the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of
- 16 the House of Representatives by June 30 of each year. This
- 17 report shall contain, at a minimum, information pertaining to
- 18 the specific use of the Sunny Day Fund money, the interest rate
- 19 and term of the Sunny Day Fund loan, the amount of principal
- 20 outstanding and interest due on the loan, and the number of jobs
- 21 created by the project. All recipients of funds under this act
- 22 shall be required to provide any and all information requested
- 23 by the Department of Commerce for the purpose of this act.
- Section 5. No funds under this act shall be awarded by the
- 25 Department of Commerce after June 30, 1989. Any funds from this
- 26 appropriation remaining unexpended or unencumbered on June 30,
- 27 1990, shall automatically lapse into the Sunny Day Fund.
- 28 Section 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
