## AN ACT

1 2 3 4	Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," providing for training for family day-care providers.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
8	as the Public Welfare Code, is amended by adding a section to
9	read:
10	Section 212. Training for Family Day Care ProvidersThe
11	department shall arrange for training for prospective and
12	current family day care providers. The training shall cover, at
13	a minimum, the following areas, as they relate to child care:
14	(1) First aid and basic safety.
15	(2) Child development, including information on

1	characteristics of infants and preschool and school-age children
2	that can assist caregivers in nurturing the physical, social,
3	emotional and intellectual growth of each child.
4	(3) Nutrition, including the Child Care Food Program
5	sponsored by the Federal Department of Agriculture.
б	(4) Health care and hygiene, including washing hands before
7	handling food, care of diapers and toilet areas.
8	(5) Small business management skills, including budgets and
9	recordkeeping.
10	(6) Discipline and guidance of children.
11	(7) Creative programming and development of proper learning
12	environments for children.
13	(8) Utilization of community resources.
14	(9) Development of communication skills of caregivers with
15	parents and families.

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
