AN ACT

Amending the act of February 1, 1966 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581), entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," authorizing boroughs to enter into contracts with the Commonwealth for police protection.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

7 hereby enacts as follows:

8 Section 1. Sections 1122 and 1202(35) of the act of February 9 1, 1966 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581), known as The Borough Code, are 10 amended to read:

11 Section 1122. Police Serving Under Cooperative Agreement or 12 Contract.--Whenever any borough shall have entered into a 13 cooperative agreement or contract with <u>the Commonwealth or</u> any 14 near or adjacent city, borough, or township for the furnishing 15 or receiving of police protection, as authorized by clause (35) 16 of section 1202 of this act, such policemen, individually, shall be appointed and accepted as policemen of the borough receiving such police service by resolution of the council of the said borough. Policemen so appointed shall, however, in so far as civil service and pensions are concerned, be deemed to be appointees and employes only of the <u>Commonwealth or of the</u> municipality or township furnishing their service and making the original appointment thereof.

8 Section 1202. Specific Powers. -- The powers of the borough 9 shall be vested in the corporate authorities. Among the specific 10 powers of the borough shall be the following, and in the 11 exercise of any of such powers involving the enactment of any ordinance or the making of any regulation, restriction or 12 13 prohibition, the borough may provide for the enforcement thereof 14 and may prescribe penalties for the violation thereof or for the 15 failure to conform thereto:

16 * * *

17 (35) Joint contracts for police and fire protection. To 18 enter into contracts with the proper authorities of the 19 <u>Commonwealth or of</u> near or adjacent cities, boroughs, or 20 townships, either for mutual aid or assistance in police and 21 fire protection, or for the furnishing to or, receiving from, 22 the Commonwealth such cities, boroughs, or townships, aid and 23 assistance in police and fire protection, and to make appropriations therefor: Provided, That in connection with such 24 25 contracts, it shall not be necessary to advertise for bids or 26 receive bonds as required for other contracts under existing 27 law. When any such contract has been entered into the police, 28 firemen or fire police of the Commonwealth or of the employing 29 city, borough or township shall have all the powers and 30 authority conferred by law on city, borough or township police, 19890H0619B0687 - 2 -

- firemen, or fire police in the territory of the city, borough or
 township which has contracted to secure such service.

- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
