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AN ACT

1 To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the
2 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the
3 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for
4 the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, and for the
5 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close
6 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990; to provide
7 appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Pennsylvania
8 Economic Revitalization Fund, the Energy Conservation and
9 Assistance Fund, The State Stores Fund and the Emergency
10 Medical Services Operating Fund to the Executive Department;
11 to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System
12 Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department; to provide
13 appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal
14 year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991, for the proper operation
15 of the several departments of the Commonwealth and the
16 Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License
17 Fund moneys; and to provide for the appropriation of Federal
18 funds to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the
19 Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted receipts
20 accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 1990, to June 30, 1991,
21 and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at
22 the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.

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2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
3 hereby enacts as follows:

4 PART I

5 GENERAL PROVISIONS

6 Section 101. Short title.--This act shall be known and may
7 be cited as the General Appropriation Act of 1990.

8 Section 102. Definitions.--The following words and phrases
9 when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in
10 this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

11 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
12 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
13 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
14 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
15 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
16 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
17 other assistants in any department, board or commission.

18 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
19 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
20 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
21 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and
22 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and
23 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,
24 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,
25 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
26 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
27 workmen's compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
28 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment
29 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
30 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee

1 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
2 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
3 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
4 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
5 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
6 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
7 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
8 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
9 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
10 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
11 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside
12 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution
13 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
14 medical assistance program.

1 Section 104. State appropriations.--(a) General Fund.--The
2 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
3 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
4 General Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the
5 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the
6 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
7 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or
8 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the
9 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the
10 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public
11 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and
12 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by
13 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the
14 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
15 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
16 1990, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
17 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.

18 (b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in
19 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
20 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the
21 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
22 of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual
23 services rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and
24 services and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by
25 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the
26 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
27 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
28 1990, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
29 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.

30 (c) Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund.--The

1 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
2 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
3 Pennsylvania Economic Revitalization Fund to the several
4 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the
5 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services
6 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and
7 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by
8 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties,
9 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set
10 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990, and for the
11 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of
12 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.

13 (d) Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund.--The following
14 sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be
15 necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the Energy
16 Conservation and Assistance Fund to the several hereinafter
17 named agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth
18 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for
19 the purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment
20 of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act,
21 necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and
22 activities and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the
23 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990, and for the payment of bills
24 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year
25 ending June 30, 1990.

26 (e) Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account.--The
27 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
28 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
29 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund,
30 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to

1 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of
2 fees for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or
3 rental of goods and services and for the payment of any other
4 expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for the
5 proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and for
6 the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning
7 July 1, 1990, and for the payment of bills incurred and
8 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30,
9 1990.

10 (f) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The
11 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
12 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
13 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several
14 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the
15 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services
16 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and
17 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by
18 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties,
19 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set
20 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990, and for the
21 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of
22 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.

23 (g) The State Stores Fund.--The following sums set forth in
24 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
25 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the
26 hereinafter named agency of the Executive Department of the
27 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services
28 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and
29 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by
30 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties,

1 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set
2 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990, and for the
3 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of
4 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.

5 (h) Motor License Fund.--The following sums, or as much
6 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the
7 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the
8 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages and other
9 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or
10 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for
11 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper
12 conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes
13 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
14 1990, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
15 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990.

16 (i) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account.--The following
17 sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
18 appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the
19 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the
20 Commonwealth for the purposes set forth herein for the fiscal
21 year beginning July 1, 1990, and for the payment of bills
22 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year
23 ending June 30, 1990.

24 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.--The
25 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this
26 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
27 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to
28 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive and
29 Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of the
30 expenses of implementing and carrying out the programs stated

1 herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990, and for the
2 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of
3 the fiscal year ending June 30, 1990. Unless otherwise stated,
4 the appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal
5 year.

6 Section 106. Job Training Partnership Act appropriations.--
7 The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as
8 may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the Job Training
9 Partnership Act (JTPA) funds to the several hereinafter named
10 agencies of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the
11 payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying out the
12 program stated herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
13 1990.

14 Section 107. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The
15 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
16 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
17 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies
18 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the
19 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are
20 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1990.

21 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small
22 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
23 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
24 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
25 low and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet
26 community development needs.

27 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services
28 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
29 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on
30 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the

1 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In
2 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old
3 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
4 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
5 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

6 (d) Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant.--
7 The Education Consolidation and Improvement Block Grant (ECIBG)
8 will be used for the administration and provision of education
9 programs in accordance with the requirements of the Omnibus
10 Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 and the 1988-1989
11 reauthorization of ECIA Chapter 2 funds.

12 (e) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
13 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
14 for the provision of preventive health and other health services
15 related to emergency medical comprehensive public health,
16 hypertension, fluoridation, health education, risk reduction,
17 home health, rape crisis and rodent control.

18 (f) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The
19 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
20 assure mothers and children access to quality maternal and child
21 health services, to reduce infant mortality and the incidence of
22 preventable disease and handicapping conditions among children,
23 to provide rehabilitative services for blind and disabled
24 individuals under the age of 16 receiving Supplemental Security
25 Income benefits and to provide medical services for children
26 with crippling conditions.

27 (g) Alcohol, Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services Block
28 Grant.--The Alcohol and Drug Abuse and Mental Health Services
29 Block Grant (ADMSBG) will be used for the administration and
30 provision of drug and alcohol abuse services and community

1 mental health services in accordance with the requirements of
2 the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

3 (h) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-
4 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
5 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income
6 families and individuals.

7 (i) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block
8 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
9 persons.

PART XI

SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR FEDERAL FUNDS

Section 1101. General Fund repository for Federal funds.--All moneys received from the Federal Government as contributions or supplements to the departments or agencies of the Commonwealth or the programs herein provided shall be paid into the General Fund.

Section 1102. Limitation on encumbering or spending Federal funds.--Federal funds shall be encumbered or spent only to the extent that such funds are estimated as being available during the fiscal year of the Commonwealth.

Section 1103. Appropriation of prior unspent Federal funds.--Any Federal money which has been previously appropriated by the General Assembly and authorized or allocated by the

1 Federal Government but remains unspent from prior fiscal years,
2 and will not be renewed for fiscal year 1990-1991, is hereby
3 appropriated.

4 Section 1104. Subgrants between Federal fund
5 appropriations.--With the exception of Federal money received
6 under JTPA and SSBG, subgrants may be made between
7 appropriations without further approval of the General Assembly.
8 The Secretary of the Budget shall submit a list of subgrants to
9 the Chairmen of the House and Senate Appropriations Committees
10 quarterly. No subgrant to a State agency, however, may be made
11 from a restricted receipt account without a specific
12 appropriation by the General Assembly.

13 Section 1105. Utilization of emergency Federal funds.--(a)
14 Federal funds available for costs and damages resulting from
15 natural disasters or civil disobedience may be added to an
16 appropriation contained in this act or to funds appropriated or
17 may be used for the purposes prescribed by the Federal
18 Government.

19 (b) In addition to the moneys appropriated by this act, all
20 moneys received from the Federal Government for the purpose of
21 disaster assistance or relief shall be paid into the General
22 Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the
23 departments, boards, commissions or agencies designated by the
24 Governor.

25 (c) In the event of any emergency situation in which the
26 General Assembly cannot act in sufficient time, the Governor is
27 authorized through executive authorization to provide up to
28 \$5,000,000 in Federal funds to alleviate the emergency
29 situation. For the purposes of this section, "emergency" is
30 defined as any situation in which there is a chance of, or which

1 may result in, substantial human suffering.

2 PART XII

3 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

4 Section 1201. Prior laws unaffected.--This act is not
5 intended to be inconsistent with or to repeal any provision of
6 any act enacted at this or any prior session of the General
7 Assembly regulating the purchase of supplies, the ordering of
8 printing and binding, the purchase, maintenance and use of
9 automobiles, the method of making payments from the State
10 Treasury for any purpose or the functioning of any
11 administrative department, board or commission.

12 Section 1202. Compliance with other law before funds
13 available.--No appropriation made by this act to any department,
14 board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be
15 available unless and until the department, board, commission or
16 agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of
17 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative
18 Code of 1929.

19 Section 1203. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or
20 committing funds.--Funds for the purchase of supplies, materials
21 and equipment shall not be deemed to be committed or encumbered
22 until contracts covering the purchase have been entered into
23 with the vendors.

24 Section 1204. Minority business set-asides.--(a) Each
25 department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed
26 in Subpart A of Part II, authorized to contract for buildings,
27 highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services, shall
28 report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to
29 anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal
30 year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.

(b) As used in this section, the term "minority business" means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.

Section 1205. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous sources.--(a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the several respective institutions for the operation and maintenance of the institutions.

(b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all moneys received from any other source, except the Federal Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein or as payment for services or materials furnished by one institution to another, except those collections designated as revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the respective appropriations.

(c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or agency for a program or administration of an act included in this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the appropriation for that program or administration of the act.

Section 1206. Lapsing of unused funds.--(a) Except as

1 otherwise provided by law or in subsections (b), (c), (d), (e),
2 (f), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l), (m), (n), (o) and (p), that
3 part of all appropriations in Parts II, III, IV, V, VI, VII,
4 VIII, and IX unexpended, uncommitted or unencumbered as of June
5 30, 1991, shall automatically lapse as of that date.

6 (b) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of
7 Community Affairs for housing and redevelopment assistance and
8 low-interest local government loans shall be two-year continuing
9 appropriations.

10 (c) The appropriations in Part II to the Department of
11 Environmental Resources for the Chesapeake Bay Pollution

13 continuing appropriations.

14 (d) The appropriation in Part II for the Department of
15 General Services for printing and distribution of the

28 EFFECTIVE DATE

29 Section 1301. Effective date.--This act shall take effect
