## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending the act of July 1, 1978 (P.L.584, No.109), entitled "An act establishing an agency to create the linkage necessary for the planning of an economic development system for Pennsylvania, and making an appropriation," further providing for powers and duties of council.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Section 6 of the act of July 1, 1978 (P.L.584,
9	No.109), known as the Milrite Act, is amended by adding
10	paragraphs to read:
11	Section 6. Powers and duties of council.

13	(11) Prepare an annual business survey under section
14	<u>6.2.</u>
15	(12) Prepare a State economic model under section 6.3.
16	* * *
17	Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
18	Section 6.2. Annual business survey.
19	(a) The council shall prepare an annual business survey to

1	ascertain the general and specific health of businesses in this
2	Commonwealth. The survey shall be prepared as follows:
3	(1) The survey shall be disseminated to businesses,
4	selected by random sample, or as may be required by standard
5	research methods, within this Commonwealth in the first three
б	weeks of July.
7	(2) The businesses shall complete the surveys and return
8	them to the department by the last business day in September
9	<u>of the same year.</u>
10	(3) The council shall compile data from the surveys and
11	prepare a report on the surveys by June 30 of the year after
12	the surveys were disseminated, completed and returned.
13	(4) The council shall use the surveys and the data
14	generated from the surveys for creating and updating the
15	State economic model authorized under section 6.3. In
16	addition, the surveys and the data generated from the surveys
17	may be made available for other research purposes under
18	section 6.3(d).
19	(5) The confidentiality of the individual surveys of
20	<u>businesses shall be preserved.</u>
21	(6) The survey may include requests for confidential
22	financial or proprietary information, but no business
23	surveyed shall be required to provide this information. The
24	survey form shall indicate that no business surveyed is
25	required to provide confidential financial or proprietary
26	information.
27	(b) The report prepared under subsection (a)(3) shall be
28	presented to the Governor and the General Assembly.
29	Section 6.3. State economic model.
30	(a) The council shall establish a State economic model:

1	(1) The council may hire field investigators to obtain
2	economic data for use in constructing the economic model.
3	(2) The council shall update the economic model.
4	(3) The council shall require a good faith effort by
5	businesses surveyed to provide accurate economic data.
6	(4) The council may offer a stipend not to exceed \$100
7	to a sampled business that provides accurate economic data.
8	(b) The State economic model shall be used to:
9	(1) Create research data for economic forecasting.
10	(2) Formulate proposed policy.
11	(3) Analyze existing and proposed policies and programs.
12	(c) The research data created by the State economic model
13	and the annual business survey under section 6.2 shall provide
14	the ability to monitor and evaluate, on the basis of standard
15	industrial classifications, changes in:
16	(1) Sector-by-sector economic activity.
17	(2) Employment levels.
18	(3) Products and market needs.
19	(4) Demographics.
20	(5) Industrial targeting, including measures of market
21	access, locational advantages and potential regional impacts.
22	(6) Product outputs sold to various economic sectors.
23	(d) Availability of the State economic model shall be as
24	<u>follows:</u>
25	(1) The data used for the construction of the State
26	economic model and data generated by the State economic model
27	shall be available:
28	(i) To the council, other administrative agencies
29	and the General assembly for use in the development of
30	economic and employment programs and for the analysis of

1	existing and proposed economic and employment policy and
2	programs.
3	(ii) For other research purposes under paragraph
4	<u>(3).</u>
5	(2) When this data is made available, the
6	confidentiality of individual surveys of businesses shall be
7	preserved.
8	(3) Upon majority vote, the council shall determine, by
9	regulation, standards and procedures for permitting requests
10	for the use of data generated from the surveys of individual
11	businesses, data used for the construction of the State
12	economic model and data generated from the State economic
13	model. Regulations under this paragraph shall include cost
14	assessments for the use of the material. Lower costs may be
15	assessed to government agencies, academic institutions,
16	nonprofit institutions and the news media.
17	(e) The council shall enter into agreements with the
18	Governor and the General Assembly for the council to prepare and
19	carry out requested economic and employment research.
20	(f) Administrative agencies shall provide assistance and
21	information to the council upon request. This subsection
22	includes such confidential information as the council deems
23	necessary for carrying out its duties under this section.
24	(g) The State economic model shall be created in a cost-
25	effective manner. The council shall periodically review the
26	costs and usefulness of the State economic model. When possible
27	and appropriate, existing data from other administrative
28	agencies shall be used. Surveys and field investigations shall
29	seek data or conformation of data not available from other
30	administrative agencies.
