AN ACT

1 Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An
2 act concerning townships of the second class; and amending,
3 revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating
4 thereto," further providing for auditors.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Section 411 of the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103,
8 No.69), known as The Second Class Township Code, reenacted and
9 amended July 10, 1947 (P.L.1481, No.567) and amended December 1,
10 1965 (P.L.1025, No.379), is amended to read:

11 Section 411. Auditors.--(a) At each municipal election, the
12 electors of each township shall elect one auditor to serve for a
13 term of six years from the first Monday of January next
14 following his election.

15 [No] (b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (c), no
16 auditor shall at the same time hold any other elective or
17 appointive township office in the township in which he is
18 employed as an auditor, and no auditor shall at the same time

1 hold any other elective or appointive school district office or
2 employment in any school district of the second, third or fourth
3 class if he audits any finances or any funds belonging to or
4 controlled by the school district.

5 (c) Where the township employs an independent accountant to
6 audit the accounts of the township pursuant to clause XLV of
7 section 702, the township auditor may serve in an appointive
8 township office in the township in which he is employed as an
9 auditor.

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
