AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as
2 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and
3 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating
4 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and
5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,
6 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding
7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic
8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the
9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and
10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing
11 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,
12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective
13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain
14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure
15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;
16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws,"
17 eliminating the transfer of funds to the Enforcement
18 Officers' Retirement Account; providing for the transfer of
19 funds remaining in the account; and providing for the
20 transfer of excess funds transferred to the Enforcement
21 Officers' Benefit Account in the State Employees' Retirement
22 Fund.

23 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
24 hereby enacts as follows:

25 Section 1. Section 802(b) of the act of April 12, 1951
26 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended
27 June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, No.14), is amended to read:

1 Section 802. Moneys Paid Into The State Stores Fund for Use
2 of the Commonwealth.--* * *

3 [(b) One-half of all application filing and transfer fees
4 shall be credited to a special account designated as the
5 Enforcement Officers' Retirement Account. The moneys credited to
6 this account shall be paid, annually, by the board to the State
7 Employees' Retirement Board to be paid into the State Employees'
8 Retirement Fund and credited to the Enforcement Officers'
9 Benefit Account.]

11 Section 2. Any funds credited to the special account in The
12 State Stores Fund designated as the Enforcement Officers'
13 Retirement Account, but not transferred to the State Employees'
14 Retirement Fund as of the effective date of this act, shall be
15 transferred to the General Fund.

16 Section 3. The sum of \$5,000,000 shall be transferred from
17 the Enforcement Officers' Benefit Account in the State
18 Employees' Retirement Fund to the General Fund within 30 days of
19 the effective date of this act. These funds represent funds in
20 excess of those determined by the actuary to be needed to cover
21 the value of benefits for retirees and any Class C benefits
22 payable from the Enforcement Officers' Benefit Account.

23 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
