AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as 2 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and 3 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and 5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession, consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding 6 7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic 8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the 9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing 10 11 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores, 12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain 13 14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure 15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures; 16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws," 17 providing for a deposit on containers sold by a State liquor 18 store. 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 20 hereby enacts as follows: 21 Section 1. - 2 <u>container on which a deposit was collected by a Pennsylvania</u>

- containers returned to them in accordance with the procedures 5
- 6 established by the board.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 7
