A RESOLUTION

- 1 Memorializing the International Committee of the Red Cross and
- 2 Red Crescent Movement and the League of the Red Cross and Red
- 3 Crescent Societies to fully recognize the Magen David Adom
- 4 Society.
- 5 WHEREAS, It has come to the attention of this legislative
- 6 body that since 1949 the International Committee of the Red
- 7 Cross has repeatedly refused to formally recognize the Magen
- 8 David Adom Society, the Israeli equivalent of other
- 9 international Red Cross societies; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The International Committee of the Red Cross
- 11 mandates the fulfillment of ten formal requirements for
- 12 recognition under the terms of the XVII International Red Cross
- 13 Conference held in Stockholm, Sweden, in 1948; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Of those ten conditions, the Israeli Magen David
- 15 Adom Society has met nine, the exception being the requirement
- 16 that the Society display one of the three symbols currently in

- 1 use as Red Cross emblems; and
- WHEREAS, The symbols currently in use (red cross, red
- 3 crescent, and a red lion and sun) reflect the differences in
- 4 religious and cultural values of the host countries where the
- 5 Red Cross Societies are found; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Israeli request for an emblem specific to its
- 7 culture reflects a need no less than the need of the Moslem
- 8 countries to use their accepted symbol; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Israel has requested that the Magen David Adom (Red
- 10 Star of David) be accepted as the emblem of its national
- 11 society, with the rationale being greater recognition and
- 12 acceptance within Israel as a currently accepted protective
- 13 symbol; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Acceptance of the Magen David Adom Society and its
- 15 emblem by the International Committee of the Red Cross and the
- 16 League of Red Cross Societies is vital to its function as an
- 17 emergency relief agency during times of peace and conflict; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The American Red Cross has formally recognized the
- 19 Magen David Adom Society as an exceptionally strong humanitarian
- 20 organization fully qualified for formal recognition and equal
- 21 status with other members of the League of Red Cross Societies;
- 22 and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Magen David Adom Society petitioned for
- 24 membership during the International Red Cross Quadrennial
- 25 Conference held in Geneva in 1986; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Rather than accepting the application after 25
- 27 years of delay, the Conference chose to reject it upon the basis
- 28 of a claim of a need for a uniform symbol throughout the
- 29 Society; and
- 30 WHEREAS, At the same time, the International Committee

- 1 changed its name to the International Committee of the Red Cross
- 2 and Red Crescent Movement, thereby negating its claim of
- 3 uniformity and bolstering the claim of Israel; therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the
- 5 International Committee of the Red Cross and Red Crescent
- 6 Movement and the League of the Red Cross and Red Crescent
- 7 Societies to fully recognize the Magen David Adom Society; and
- 8 be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 10 Rabbi Rubin R. Dobin, International Chairman, Operation
- 11 Recognition; the International Committee of the Red Cross and
- 12 Red Crescent Societies, and the League of Red Cross and Red
- 13 Crescent Societies.
