A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the week of October 15 through 21, 1989, as Forest
- 2 Products Week and urging citizens to observe the importance
- 3 of forest products.
- 4 WHEREAS, The forest products industry has played an enduring
- 5 and vital role in the economic life of our State, from the
- 6 growing and harvesting of trees to the manufacture of paper and
- 7 wood products; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The demand for wood products is projected to grow
- 9 throughout this century and into the next; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The forest products industry employs 1.4 million
- 11 people with wages and salaries of over \$1 billion and will
- 12 continue to employ numerous Pennsylvanians in both forest and
- 13 factory as they work to meet this growing demand; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Wood is a renewable resource which will not be
- 15 depleted as long as our foresters and natural resource
- 16 professionals continue to find ways to effectively manage the
- 17 forests in Pennsylvania, which cover 16,825,900 acres or 58.5%

- 1 of the total acreage in this Commonwealth; and
- WHEREAS, Other states in the nation are observing the
- 3 importance of the forest products industry during National
- 4 Forest Products Week, the week of October 15 through 21, 1989,
- 5 and National Forest Products Week will carry the theme "Managing
- 6 the Future of America's Forests"; therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 8 week of October 15 through 21, 1989, as Forest Products Week;
- 9 and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge all citizens
- 11 to observe the important role that forest products play in our
- 12 daily lives and in Pennsylvania's economic life.
