A RESOLUTION

- 1 Relating to the use of treated lumber for playground or
- 2 recreational equipment.
- 3 WHEREAS, Our children are viewed as our most precious of
- 4 possessions; and
- 5 WHEREAS, As such, we seek to provide them with the very best
- 6 of all possible environments, including the school environment;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Playground and recreation equipment is an integral
- 9 part of the school environment; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Many times lumber products are used in the
- 11 construction of playground and recreation equipment; and
- 12 WHEREAS, So-called "pressure-treated lumber" may be used to
- 13 construct playground and recreation equipment; and
- 14 WHEREAS, "Pressure-treated lumber" has been preserved with
- 15 chemical preservatives such as creosote, tetrachlorophenol and
- 16 pentachlorophenol (PCP); compounds of arsenic, chromium, copper,
- 17 zinc, boron and mercury; and certain chlorinated pesticides; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Many of these chemicals have serious health effects;
- 2 therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 4 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge all State and local municipal
- 5 agencies, school districts and public and private nonprofit
- 6 organizations review and take into consideration all matters
- 7 relating to the safety and appropriateness of purchasing
- 8 recreational equipment made from "pressure-treated" lumber that
- 9 has been treated with any of the aforementioned substances,
- 10 where there is a likelihood of contact by children, in an effort
- 11 to prevent subjecting children to these possible health hazards.
