AN ACT

Amending the act of July 23, 1968 (P.L.686, No.226), entitled "An act equalizing trade practices in public works 3 procurement; authorizing the purchase by the Commonwealth, its political subdivisions, and all public agencies, of 5 aluminum and steel products produced in a foreign country, provided the foreign country does not prohibit or discriminate against the importation to, sale or use in the 7 8 foreign country of supplies, material or equipment 9 manufactured in this Commonwealth; establishing procedures for determining whether foreign countries discriminate 10 against supplies, materials or equipment manufactured in this 11 Commonwealth; and imposing penalties and providing for relief 12 for violation of this act," providing for an exemption in the 13 14 case of Federal-aid projects. 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 16 hereby enacts as follows: The act of July 23, 1968 (P.L.686, No.226), 17 18 entitled "An act equalizing trade practices in public works procurement; authorizing the purchase by the Commonwealth, its political subdivisions, and all public agencies, of aluminum and 20 21 steel products produced in a foreign country, provided the 22 foreign country does not prohibit or discriminate against the

- 8 <u>if the Secretary of Transportation determines that its</u>
- 9 application would impair the receipt of Federal aid.
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
