AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 2 Statutes, further providing for fines, penalties and reports
- 3 by issuing authorities.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 6322(a) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 6322. Reports by issuing authorities.
- 9 (a) General rule.--Subject to any inconsistent procedures
- 10 and standards relating to reports and transmission of funds
- 11 prescribed pursuant to Title 42 (relating to judiciary and
- 12 judicial procedure):
- 13 (1) Following the fifteenth and last days of each month,
- 14 every issuing authority shall prepare a statement, upon forms
- 15 prescribed and furnished by the department, of all fines
- 16 collected, bail forfeited, sentence imposed and final
- 17 disposition for all cases on violations of or adjudications
- 18 of delinquency under any provisions of this title decided by

- 1 the issuing authority in the semimonthly reporting period
- 2 just concluded. The statement shall be certified by the
- 3 issuing authority to be true and correct and shall be
- 4 forwarded to the department within the following week, with a
- 5 copy sent to the police department which filed the charge.
- 6 Any fines and bail forfeited payable to the Commonwealth
- 7 under Subchapter E of Chapter 35 of Title 42 (relating to
- fines, etc.) shall accompany the report to the department.
- 9 (2) The report shall include the identifying number of
- 10 the citation, the name and residence address of the party
- 11 charged, the driver's license number, the registration number
- of the vehicle involved, a description of the offense, the
- 13 section and subsection of the statute or ordinance violated,
- the date of hearing, the plea, the judgment or whether bail
- was forfeited, clear and concise reasons supporting the
- adjudication, the sentence or amount of forfeiture and such
- other information as the department may require.

- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
