AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania 2 Consolidated Statutes, specifically providing for sexual
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, specifically providing for sexual offenses by psychotherapists; prohibiting a defense with
- 4 respect to such offenses; and providing for restitution.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 9 § 3129. Psychotherapist sexual offenses.
- 10 (a) Sexual assault by a psychotherapist.--A psychotherapist
- 11 commits sexual assault, a felony of the third degree, when he
- 12 engages in sexual intercourse, as defined in section 3101
- 13 (relating to definitions), with his patient or client,
- 14 regardless of whether it occurred during any treatment,
- 15 consultation, assessment, interview or examination where the act
- 16 occurred during the ongoing therapist-patient or therapist-

- 1 client relationship or within six months of the termination of
- 2 the relationship.
- 3 (b) Deviate sexual intercourse by a psychotherapist.--A
- 4 psychotherapist commits deviate sexual intercourse, a felony of
- 5 the third degree, when he engages in deviate sexual intercourse,
- 6 <u>as defined in section 3101, with his patient or client,</u>
- 7 regardless of whether it occurred during any treatment,
- 8 consultation, assessment, interview or examination where the act
- 9 <u>occurred during the ongoing therapist-patient or therapist-</u>
- 10 client relationship or within six months of the termination of
- 11 the relationship.
- 12 (c) Indecent assault by a psychotherapist.--A
- 13 psychotherapist commits indecent assault, a misdemeanor of the
- 14 second degree, when he has indecent contact, as defined in
- 15 <u>section 3101</u>, with his patient or client, regardless of whether
- 16 <u>it occurred during any treatment, consultation, assessment,</u>
- 17 <u>interview or examination where the act occurred during the</u>
- 18 ongoing therapist-patient or therapist-client relationship or
- 19 within six months of the termination of the relationship.
- 20 (d) Prohibited defense. -- It shall not be a defense to a
- 21 prosecution brought under this section that the patient or
- 22 client consented to the act.
- 23 (e) Prosecutions under subsection (a), (b) or (c).--In
- 24 prosecutions under subsection (a), (b) or (c), physical or
- 25 mental injury to the patient need not be established.
- 26 (f) Restitution. -- Upon sentencing a defendant for a
- 27 conviction under this section, the court may order, pursuant to
- 28 <u>42 Pa.C.S. § 9721(c) (relating to sentencing generally), that</u>
- 29 the defendant pay the cost of rehabilitative psychotherapy for
- 30 the victim.

- 1 (q) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 2 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 3 subsection:
- 4 <u>"Patient" or "client." A person who seeks or obtains the</u> <-
- 5 <u>services of a psychotherapist, whether or not that person is</u>
- 6 charged for the services.
- 7 <u>"Psychotherapist." A psychiatrist, psychologist,</u>
- 8 psychoanalyst, registered nurse certified to practice
- 9 psychotherapy, mental health counselor, chemical dependency
- 10 <u>counselor</u>, <u>hypnotist or other person</u>, <u>whether or not licensed by</u>
- 11 the Commonwealth, who performs or purports to perform
- 12 psychotherapy.
- 13 <u>"Psychotherapy." The professional treatment, assessment or</u>
- 14 <u>counseling of a mental or emotional illness, symptom or</u>
- 15 condition.
- 16 "PATIENT" OR "CLIENT." A PERSON WHO RECEIVES
- 17 PSYCHOTHERAPEUTIC SERVICES FROM A PSYCHOTHERAPIST, REGARDLESS OF

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- 18 WHETHER THE PSYCHOTHERAPIST RECEIVES REMUNERATION FOR THE
- 19 SERVICES FROM THE PERSON.
- 20 <u>"PSYCHOTHERAPIST." A PSYCHIATRIST, PSYCHOLOGIST,</u>
- 21 PSYCHOANALYST, REGISTERED NURSE CERTIFIED TO PRACTICE
- 22 PSYCHOTHERAPY, MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELOR, CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY
- 23 COUNSELOR, HYPNOTIST, MEMBER OF THE CLERGY, CLINICAL SOCIAL
- 24 WORKER OR ANY PERSON WHO REPRESENTS HIMSELF AS SUCH, WHETHER OR
- 25 NOT LICENSED BY THE COMMONWEALTH, WHO PROVIDES PSYCHOTHERAPEUTIC
- 26 <u>SERVICES TO PATIENTS OR CLIENTS.</u>
- 27 "PSYCHOTHERAPY." THE PROFESSIONAL TREATMENT OF A MENTAL OR
- 28 EMOTIONAL ILLNESS OR DISABILITY THROUGH THE CREATION OF AN
- 29 ONGOING THERAPEUTIC RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE THERAPIST AND THE
- 30 PATIENT OR CLIENT.

- 1 Section 2. The provisions of this act are severable. If any
- 2 provision of this act or its application to any person or
- 3 circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect
- 4 other provisions or applications of this act which can be given
- 5 effect without the invalid provision or application.
- 6 Section 3. This act shall apply to offenses committed on or
- 7 after the effective date of this act.
- 8 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
