AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987, No.394), entitled, as amended, "An act to preserve and improve the purity of the waters of the Commonwealth for the protection of public health, animal and aquatic life, and for industrial consumption, and recreation; empowering and directing the creation of indebtedness or the issuing of non-debt revenue
8	bonds by political subdivisions to provide works to abate pollution; providing protection of water supply and water
9	quality; providing for the jurisdiction of courts in the
10	enforcement thereof; providing additional remedies for
11	abating pollution of waters; imposing certain penalties;
12	repealing certain acts; regulating discharges of sewage and
13 14	industrial wastes; regulating the operation of mines and regulating the impact of mining upon water quality, supply
15	and quantity; placing responsibilities upon landowners and
16	land occupiers and to maintain primary jurisdiction over
17	surface coal mining in Pennsylvania," providing for
18	designation and conservation of exceptional value waters.
19	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
20	hereby enacts as follows:
21	Section 1. Section 1 of the act of June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987,
22	No.394), known as The Clean Streams Law, is amended by adding a
23	definition to read:
24	Section 1. DefinitionsBe it enacted, &c., That the

following words or phrases, unless the context clearly indicates
 otherwise, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this
 section.

5 <u>"Exceptional value waters" shall be construed to include</u>
6 those waters and watersheds designated by the Environmental
7 Quality Board as exceptional value waters in compliance with the
8 criteria and procedures of section 5.1 of this act.

9 * * *

10 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read: 11 Section 5.1. Exceptional Value Waters. -- (a) Following the procedures set forth in this section, the Environmental Quality 12 13 Board may by regulation designate a specific stream or 14 watershed, or portions of a stream or watershed, as exceptional 15 value waters if the stream or watershed meets one or more of the 16 following criteria: 17 (1) The stream or watershed was classified as exceptional 18 value waters pursuant to final regulations adopted by the 19 Environmental Quality Board prior to January 1, 1989. 20 (2) The stream or watershed is located within the corridor 21 of a stream which has been designated as "wild" or "scenic" pursuant to the act of December 5, 1972 (P.L.1277, No.283), 22 known as the "Pennsylvania Scenic Rivers Act" or the Wild and 23 24 Scenic Rivers Act (Public Law 90-542, 16 U.S.C. § 1271 et seq.). 25 (3) The stream or watershed constitute waters flowing within 26 or contiguous to a national, State or county park or forest, 27 State game lands, or other lands owned by the Federal Government or the Commonwealth for conservation purposes. 28 29 (4) The stream or watershed constitutes a "wilderness trout stream" designated by the Pennsylvania Fish Commission. 30

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1	(5) The stream or watershed is located in the watershed of,
2	and is important to maintaining the quality of, surface waters
3	used by an existing unfiltered public drinking water supply.
4	(6) The Environmental Quality Board finds, after study,
5	<u>that:</u>
6	(i) stream or watershed exhibits water quality meeting at
7	least the water quality criteria for "high quality waters" as
8	set forth in the department's regulations; and
9	(ii) the stream or watershed constitutes an outstanding
10	<u>national, State or regional resource.</u>
11	(b) (1) Except as provided in clause (2) of this
12	subsection, prior to proposal of rules designating an
13	exceptional value water, the department shall prepare an
14	environmental, social and economic impact assessment report.
15	Such report shall:
16	(i) Identify the area and location of the stream and
17	watershed to be designated.
18	(ii) Evaluate the existing water quality, environmental and
19	ecological values of the stream and watershed.
20	(iii) Describe and evaluate the impact of existing and
21	proposed land uses with the watershed to be designated.
22	(iv) Describe and assess the effect of an exceptional value
23	designation on existing and proposed uses of public and private
24	lands adjacent to or in the watershed of the wetland, including
25	impacts upon the value of any private lands which may be
26	affected or restricted by such designation.
27	(2) An environmental, social and economic impact assessment
28	shall not be required where at least ninety per cent of the
29	stream or watershed proposed for designation is located upon the
30	land or lands owned by the Federal Government, the Commonwealth,
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1	a county, municipality or public water supply agency.		
2	(c) Prior to adopting regulations designating a stream or		
3	watershed as exceptional value waters, a public hearing shall be		
4	held in the county where the stream or watershed is located.		
5	Notice of the public hearing shall be given at least three weeks		
6	before in a newspaper of general circulation in the county. At		
7	<u>least three weeks prior to such hearing, notice shall also be</u>		
8	given by first class mail to any applicants with pending		
9	applications for discharge permits in the watershed covered by		
10	the petition and any applicants with pending requests for		
11	revision, amendment or supplement of official plans submitted		
12	<u>pursuant to the act of January 24, 1966 (1965 P.L.1535, No.537),</u>		
13	known as the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act."		
14	(d) (1) Any petition filed pursuant to section 1920-A of		
15	<u>the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as "The</u>		
16	Administrative Code of 1929, " requesting the Environmental		
17	Quality Board to designate a stream or watershed as exceptional		
18	value waters shall be considered pursuant to the procedures set		
19	forth in this subsection.		
20	(2) The petition shall provide the following information:		
21	(i) The location and area of the watershed covered by the		
22	petition, including a map or maps published by the United States		
23	Geological Survey, indicating the perimeter of the area proposed		
24	for designation.		
25	(ii) A summary and analysis of available water quality		
26	information regarding instream water chemistry.		
27	(iii) Data regarding land ownership in the watershed.		
28	(iv) A description of the patterns and location of existing		
29	land use and development in the watershed.		
30	(v) A description of present and proposed land use controls		
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1 or plans in the watershed.

2 (vi) A detailed description of existing water uses in the 3 watershed.

4 (vii) Detailed supporting evidence establishing that the 5 stream or watershed qualifies for designation as exceptional value waters under the criteria set forth in subsection (a). 6 7 (viii) The petitioner's name, address and telephone number. (ix) Identification of the petitioner's interest which may 8 be affected by the proposed designation. 9 (3) Within thirty days of receipt of a petition, the 10 11 department shall notify the petitioner by certified mail whether 12 or not the petition is complete as required by this section. 13 (4) Within thirty days of receipt of a petition, the department shall notify by first class mail, any applicants with 14 pending applications for discharge permits in the watershed 15 covered by the petition and any applicants with pending requests 16 for revision, amendment or supplement of official plans 17 18 submitted pursuant to the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act." 19 (e) No petition or proposal to designate a stream or 20 watershed as exceptional value waters shall have any effect or be considered in the review and approval of permit applications 21 22 submitted under any act administered by the department unless 23 and until such designation is adopted by the Environmental Quality Board as final rulemaking. 24

25 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
