AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, 3 special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, primary and election expenses and election contests; creating 5 and defining membership of county boards of elections; 6 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, 7 courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 8 9 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections," increasing the compensation of judges of 11 12 election. 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 14 15 Section 1. Section 412.1 of the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code, 16 17 added May 5, 1982 (P.L.374, No.108), is amended to read: 18 Section 412.1. Compensation of Election Officers.--(a) 19 all counties, the compensation of judges, inspectors, clerks and 20 machine inspectors shall be fixed by the county board of 21 elections of the county at not less than the following: judge of elections, [forty-five dollars (\$45.00)] ninety dollars 22

- 1 (\$90.00); inspectors and clerks, forty dollars (\$40.00); and
- 2 machine operators, forty dollars (\$40.00); and not more than the
- 3 following: judge of elections, [seventy dollars (\$70.00)] one
- 4 <u>hundred forty dollars (\$140.00)</u>; inspectors and clerks, sixty-
- 5 five dollars (\$65.00) and machine operators, sixty-five dollars
- 6 (\$65.00); for each primary and election. The county board of
- 7 elections may, in its discretion, establish different per diem
- 8 rates within the above mentioned minima and maxima based on the
- 9 number of votes cast for the following groups: 150 votes or
- 10 less, 151 to 300 votes, 301 to 500 votes, 501 to 750 votes, 751
- 11 and over.
- 12 (b) For transmitting returns of primaries and elections and
- 13 the ballot box or boxes, all judges of elections shall each be
- 14 entitled to receive the additional sum of six dollars (\$6.00).
- 15 (c) In counties of the second through eighth classes, the
- 16 county board of elections may require the minority inspector of
- 17 elections to accompany the judge of elections in transmitting
- 18 returns of primaries and elections, in which case the minority
- 19 inspector of elections shall be entitled to receive the
- 20 additional sum of six dollars (\$6.00).
- 21 (d) The person furnishing transportation to the judge of
- 22 election and the minority inspector in transmitting returns and
- 23 ballot boxes, shall be entitled to a minimum of twenty cents
- 24 (20ç) per mile circular from the polling place to the county
- 25 courthouse. The name of such person shall appear on the voucher
- 26 of the judge of election and only one person shall receive
- 27 mileage compensation.
- 28 (e) When a primary and special election or a special and
- 29 general or municipal election take place on the same day, they
- 30 shall be construed as one election for the purpose of receiving

- 1 compensation.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 2
