THE TERM "EXPENSES" ALSO SHALL 27 INCLUDE THE MEDICAL COSTS FOR THE TREATMENT OF INMATES OF STATE 28 INSTITUTIONS WHEN THE INMATE MUST BE TRANSFERRED TO AN OUTSIDE 29 HOSPITAL: PROVIDED, THAT IN NO CASE SHALL THE STATE INSTITUTION 30 PAY MORE FOR PATIENT CARE THAN THAT PROVIDED UNDER THE STATE 19910H1320B3703 - 8 -

18 APPROPRIATIONS.--WITH THE EXCEPTION OF FEDERAL MONEY RECEIVED 19 UNDER JTPA AND SSBG, SUBGRANTS MAY BE MADE BETWEEN 20 APPROPRIATIONS WITHOUT FURTHER APPROVAL OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY. 21 THE SECRETARY OF THE BUDGET SHALL SUBMIT A LIST OF SUBGRANTS TO 22 THE CHAIRMEN OF THE HOUSE AND SENATE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEES 23 QUARTERLY. NO SUBGRANT TO A STATE AGENCY, HOWEVER, MAY BE MADE 24 FROM A RESTRICTED RECEIPT ACCOUNT WITHOUT A SPECIFIC

25 APPROPRIATION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

26 SECTION 1405. UTILIZATION OF EMERGENCY FEDERAL FUNDS.--(A) 27 FEDERAL FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR COSTS AND DAMAGES RESULTING FROM 28 NATURAL DISASTERS OR CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE MAY BE ADDED TO AN 29 APPROPRIATION CONTAINED IN THIS ACT OR TO FUNDS APPROPRIATED OR 30 MAY BE USED FOR THE PURPOSES PRESCRIBED BY THE FEDERAL 19910H1320B3703 - 187 - 1 GOVERNMENT.

2 (B) IN ADDITION TO THE MONEYS APPROPRIATED BY THIS ACT, ALL
3 MONEYS RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF
4 DISASTER ASSISTANCE OR RELIEF SHALL BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL
5 FUND AND ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED OUT OF THE GENERAL FUND TO THE
6 DEPARTMENTS, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS OR AGENCIES DESIGNATED BY THE

8 (C) IN THE EVENT OF ANY EMERGENCY SITUATION IN WHICH THE 9 GENERAL ASSEMBLY CANNOT ACT IN SUFFICIENT TIME, THE GOVERNOR IS 10 AUTHORIZED THROUGH EXECUTIVE AUTHORIZATION TO PROVIDE UP TO 11 \$5,000,000 IN FEDERAL FUNDS TO ALLEVIATE THE EMERGENCY 12 SITUATION. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "EMERGENCY" IS 13 DEFINED AS ANY SITUATION IN WHICH THERE IS A CHANCE OF OR WHICH 14 MAY RESULT IN SUBSTANTIAL HUMAN SUFFERING.

PART XV

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

17 SECTION 1501. PRIOR LAWS UNAFFECTED.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN 18 SECTION 253, THIS ACT IS NOT INTENDED TO BE INCONSISTENT WITH OR 19 TO REPEAL ANY PROVISION OF ANY ACT ENACTED AT THIS OR ANY PRIOR 20 SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGULATING THE PURCHASE OF 21 SUPPLIES, THE ORDERING OF PRINTING AND BINDING, THE PURCHASE, 22 MAINTENANCE AND USE OF AUTOMOBILES, THE METHOD OF MAKING 23 PAYMENTS FROM THE STATE TREASURY FOR ANY PURPOSE OR THE 24 FUNCTIONING OF ANY ADMINISTRATIVE DEPARTMENT, BOARD OR 25 COMMISSION.

26 SECTION 1502. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAW BEFORE FUNDS 27 AVAILABLE.--NO APPROPRIATION MADE BY THIS ACT TO ANY DEPARTMENT, 28 BOARD, COMMISSION OR AGENCY OF THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE 29 AVAILABLE UNLESS AND UNTIL THE DEPARTMENT, BOARD, COMMISSION OR 30 AGENCY HAS COMPLIED WITH SECTIONS 615 AND 616 OF THE ACT OF 19910H1320B3703 - 188 - 1 APRIL 9, 1929 (P.L.177, NO.175), KNOWN AS THE ADMINISTRATIVE 2 CODE OF 1929.

3 SECTION 1503. CONTRACTS PREREQUISITE TO ENCUMBERING OR
4 COMMITTING FUNDS.--FUNDS FOR THE PURCHASE OF SUPPLIES, MATERIALS
5 AND EQUIPMENT SHALL NOT BE DEEMED TO BE COMMITTED OR ENCUMBERED
6 UNTIL CONTRACTS COVERING THE PURCHASE HAVE BEEN ENTERED INTO
7 WITH THE VENDORS.

8 SECTION 1504. 19 SECTION 1505. APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FROM MISCELLANEOUS 20 SOURCES.--(A) IN ADDITION TO THE AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED BY THIS 21 ACT, MONEYS RECEIVED IN PAYMENT FOR FOOD AND HOUSEHOLD SUPPLIES 22 FURNISHED TO EMPLOYEES AND OTHER PERSONS, EXCEPT INMATES, BY AN INSTITUTION, AND MONEYS RECEIVED FROM THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE 23 24 OF ANY PRODUCTS OF THE SOIL, MEATS, LIVESTOCK, TIMBER OR OTHER 25 MATERIALS SOLD BY THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL 26 FUND AND ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED OUT OF THE GENERAL FUND TO THE 27 SEVERAL RESPECTIVE INSTITUTIONS FOR THE OPERATION AND 28 MAINTENANCE OF THE INSTITUTIONS.

29 (B) IN ADDITION TO THE AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED BY THIS ACT, ALL 30 MONEYS RECEIVED FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE, EXCEPT THE FEDERAL 19910H1320B3703 - 189 - GOVERNMENT, AS CONTRIBUTIONS FOR THE PROGRAMS PROVIDED HEREIN OR
 AS PAYMENT FOR SERVICES OR MATERIALS FURNISHED BY ONE
 INSTITUTION TO ANOTHER, EXCEPT THOSE COLLECTIONS DESIGNATED AS
 REVENUES, SHALL BE PAID INTO THE GENERAL FUND AND ARE HEREBY
 APPROPRIATED OUT OF THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE
 RESPECTIVE APPROPRIATIONS.
