12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- 15 (P.L.508, No.142), known as the Sunset Act, amended December 16,

16 1982 (P.L.1355, No.310), are amended to read:

17 Section 4. Powers and duties of the Leadership Committee.

- 18 The committee shall have the power and its duty shall be:
- 19 (1) To direct and coordinate the implementation of the
- 20 sunset review procedure.
- 21 (2) To assign the responsibility for the review and
- 22 evaluation of each agency scheduled for such review and
- 23 evaluation under the provisions of this act to an appropriate
- 24 standing committee of the Senate or the House of
- 25 Representatives or to appropriate standing committees of both
- 26 Houses who shall operate jointly to review and evaluate the
- 27 agency, if such joint operation is authorized by the rules of
- 28 the House and Senate. The assignments for review and
- 29 evaluation shall be made in January of the year in which the
- 30 agency is scheduled to be terminated. If any committee which

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1 has been assigned an agency for review and evaluation fails to complete its duties within a reasonable period of time as 2 3 determined by the Leadership Committee, it shall be discharged from further review or consideration of the 4 5 agency. The Leadership Committee shall then reassign the agency to another committee for review and evaluation 6 7 pursuant to this act. 8 (3) To assign tasks to the Legislative Budget and 9 Finance Committee for the purpose of conducting performance audits. Such tasks shall receive priority from the 10 11 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee. The Leadership 12 Committee may waive, by majority vote, the requirement that 13 the performance audit be completed in accordance with United States General Accounting Office standards as described in 14 15 section 2 under the following circumstances: 16 (i) the agency has not held any meetings or 17 considered any cases for a period of three years or more; 18 or (ii) the agency has a budget of less than \$100,000 19 20 annually unless the agency is a departmental board or 21 commission within the Bureau of Professional and 22 Occupational Affairs, Department of State. 23 In the event that the United States General Accounting Office 2.4 standards are waived, the Leadership Committee shall direct 25 the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to complete a 26 summary audit in lieu of the performance audit, and specify 27 the scope of such audit by September 1 of the year prior to 28 the agency's termination. 29 [(4) To authorize, if necessary, a postponement of the review or termination of an agency for a period not exceeding 30

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1 one year.]

2 Section 5. Evaluation and review.

3 (a) The standing committee designated by the Leadership 4 Committee shall develop a plan for the evaluation and review of an agency in conjunction with the Legislative Budget and Finance 5 Committee and representatives of the agency being evaluated.] 6 7 (b) The standing committee shall hold at least one public hearing for each evaluation and review of an agency. At the 8 hearing, the highest ranking officer of the agency or an 9 10 individual appointed by him shall bear the burden to testify 11 concerning the need for continued existence of the agency. The committee shall receive other testimony at the public hearing as 12 13 it shall deem appropriate. (c) The standing committee shall elicit information in each 14 15 evaluation and review of an agency from the Office of the 16 Auditor General and the Offices of Budget and Administration as to the financial efficiency of the agency being reviewed. The 17 18 committee may request and the agency, subject to termination shall provide such information as the committee deems pertinent 19 20 to its evaluation and review. (d) The standing committee shall make a determination in 21 22 each evaluation and review as to whether the agency shall be 23 continued, altered or terminated. The committee shall base its determination on the following criteria: 24

25 (1) whether termination would significantly harm or
 26 endanger the public health, safety or welfare;

27 (2) whether there is overlap or duplication of effort by
 28 other agencies that permit the termination of the agency;

29 (3) whether there is a more economical way of

30 accomplishing the objectives of the agency;

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1	(4) whether there is a demonstrated need, based on
2	service to the public, for the continuing existence of the
3	agency;
4	(5) whether the operation of the agency has been in the
т 5	public interest;

6	(6) whether the agency has encouraged public
7	participation in the making of its rules and decisions or
8	whether the agency has permitted participation solely by the
9	persons it regulates;
10	(7) whether there is an alternate, less restrictive
11	method of providing the same services to the public; and
12	(8) such other criteria as may be established by the
13	standing committees.
14	(e) Such standing committees shall draft a report concerning
15	each evaluation and review, stating in that report their
16	findings, their determination as to whether the agency should be
17	continued, altered or terminated, and the reasons for such a
18	determination together with a draft of appropriate legislation
19	to implement the committees' recommendations. The report shall
20	be available for public inspection in the Office of the
21	Secretary of the Senate and of the Chief Clerk of the House of
22	Representatives. The report shall be made to the General
23	Assembly on or before the first session day of September of the
24	year in which the agency in question is scheduled for
25	termination. Once the report is received by each House, the
26	appropriate legislation shall be introduced and referred to a
27	standing committee, in keeping with the rules of each House and
28	be acted on accordingly.
29	(f) On or before March 1 of the year in which the agency in
30	question is scheduled for termination, the standing committees
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1	designated by the Leadership Committee as responsible for the
2	evaluation and review of the agency shall receive:
3	(1) from the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee, a
4	performance audit or summary audit; and
5	(2) from the Legislative Reference Bureau, a report
6	outlining all legislation, then in effect, pertaining to the
7	creation, operation, duties, powers and funding of the
8	agency.

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agency scheduled for termination which are transferred to 1 another agency scheduled for termination at an earlier date, 2 shall be subject to sunset review at the date scheduled for 3 4 termination of the transferee agency. However, between the time 5 at which the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee submits its performance audit to the standing committee and the standing 6 7 committee makes its recommendation to the General Assembly, the Governor shall not utilize a reorganization plan, executive 8 order, rule or regulation or comparable authority to transfer 9 10 any programs, activities or functions of an agency being 11 evaluated. 12 (e) The termination of any agency under this act shall serve 13 to terminate any advisory agency, whether created by statute or 14 administrative action, established for the primary purpose of 15 advising or assisting the terminated agency. 16 (f) Agencies terminated shall be given [until June 30 of the year following the one in which they are terminated] 180 days 17 18 from the termination date to wind up their affairs. During that 19 period, the Governor may petition the General Assembly for a 20 review of the termination but the agency shall be terminated 21 unless the General Assembly passes a law to the contrary. 22 (q) The terms of office of appointees of an agency 23 terminated under this act shall end [on June 30 of the year 24 following] <u>180 days from the</u> termination <u>date</u>. 25 Section 3. Reestablishment or continuation of agencies. 28 (a) Any agency scheduled for termination under this act, may 29 be reestablished by the General Assembly, by legislation. Each 30 reestablishment as provided in this subsection or continued as 19910H1491B4192 - 16 -

- 1 provided in subsection (b) shall be:
- (1) for a period of ten years unless otherwise specified 2 3 in the legislation and again be subject to evaluation, review 4 and termination as provided in [the] this act; and 5 (2) by legislation in a separate bill, in which no more 6 than one agency shall be reestablished and such agency shall be mentioned in the title of the bill. 7 8 (b) [Unless] If no legislation is enacted [prior to November 1,] reestablishing an agency as provided in subsection (a) by a 9 date 60 days prior to the termination date, the presiding 10 officer of each House shall cause to be placed on their 11 respective calendars for the first legislative day [in November] 12 13 after the date 60 days prior to the termination date, the question, in the form of a resolution, of whether an agency 14 15 scheduled for termination [on December 31 of that year] shall be continued. If a majority of the members elected to each House 16 approve such a resolution, the resolution shall be presented to 17 18 the Governor in accordance with section 9 of Article III of the Constitution of Pennsylvania. No statute shall be deemed to continue an agency beyond a termination date 27 28 established for said agency pursuant to this act, unless the 29 statute expressly reenacts the agency in its present or altered 30 state.

THE COMMITTEE FORMED PURSUANT TO THE ACT OF AUGUST 4, 1959 (P.L.587, NO.195), 24 25 ENTITLED, AS AMENDED, "AN ACT CREATING AND ESTABLISHING THE 26 LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE; PROVIDING FOR ITS 27 MEMBERSHIP; PRESCRIBING ITS POWERS, FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES; 28 PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND OTHER 29 PERSONNEL, AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION."

30 "PERFORMANCE AUDIT." A WRITTEN REPORT BY THE LEGISLATIVE 19910H1491B4192 - 18 - BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE EVALUATING THE MANAGEMENT AND
 PERFORMANCE OF ANY AGENCY BASED ON THE STATISTICS ON ITS
 OPERATIONS AND CARRIED OUT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STANDARDS FOR
 PERFORMANCE AND FINANCIAL COMPLIANCE AUDITING DEVELOPED BY THE
 UNITED STATES GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE. IT SHALL DETERMINE
 WHETHER THE AGENCY:

7 (1) IS CONDUCTING AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES OR PROGRAMS IN A
8 MANNER CONSISTENT WITH ACCOMPLISHING THE OBJECTIVES INTENDED
9 BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

10 (2) IS CONDUCTING PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES AND EXPENDING
 11 FUNDS MADE AVAILABLE IN A FAITHFUL, EFFICIENT, ECONOMICAL AND
 12 EFFECTIVE MANNER.

13 THIS REPORT SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, THE CRITERIA 14 LISTED IN SECTION 5(D).

15 SECTION 3. SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE.

16 THERE IS CREATED A JOINT COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO BE KNOWN AS THE SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE. THE COMMITTEE SHALL 17 18 BE COMPOSED OF THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE OF THE SENATE, THE 19 MAJORITY AND MINORITY LEADERS OF THE SENATE, THE SPEAKER OF THE 20 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE MAJORITY AND MINORITY LEADERS 21 OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 22 REPRESENTATIVES SHALL SERVE AS THE TEMPORARY CHAIRMAN OF THE 23 COMMITTEE UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE COMMITTEE SHALL ELECT A 24 CHAIRMAN. MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE MAY DESIGNATE ALTERNATE 25 MEMBERS OF THEIR RESPECTIVE CHAMBERS WHO WILL HAVE THE SAME 26 POWERS AND DUTIES AS REGULAR MEMBERS.

27 SECTION 4. POWERS AND DUTIES OF SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE.
28 (A) GENERAL RULE.--THE SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE HAS THE
29 FOLLOWING POWERS AND DUTIES:

30 (1) TO DIRECT AND COORDINATE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 19910H1491B4192 - 19 - 1 SUNSET REVIEW PROCEDURE.

2 (2) TO ASSIGN THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE REVIEW AND 3 EVALUATION OF EACH AGENCY SCHEDULED FOR SUCH REVIEW AND 4 EVALUATION UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT TO AN APPROPRIATE 5 STANDING COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE OR THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OR TO APPROPRIATE STANDING COMMITTEES OF BOTH 6 7 HOUSES WHO SHALL OPERATE JOINTLY TO REVIEW AND EVALUATE THE 8 AGENCY, IF SUCH JOINT OPERATION IS AUTHORIZED BY THE RULES OF 9 THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. THE ASSIGNMENTS FOR REVIEW AND EVALUATION SHALL BE MADE NOT LESS THAN 11 MONTHS 10 11 BEFORE THE AGENCY'S TERMINATION DATE. IF ANY STANDING 12 COMMITTEE WHICH HAS BEEN ASSIGNED AN AGENCY FOR REVIEW AND 13 EVALUATION FAILS TO COMPLETE ITS DUTIES WITHIN A REASONABLE PERIOD OF TIME AS DETERMINED BY THE SUNSET LEADERSHIP 14 15 COMMITTEE, IT SHALL BE DISCHARGED FROM FURTHER REVIEW OR 16 CONSIDERATION OF THE AGENCY. THE SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE 17 SHALL THEN REASSIGN THE AGENCY TO ANOTHER STANDING COMMITTEE 18 FOR REVIEW AND EVALUATION PURSUANT TO THIS ACT.

(3) TO ASSIGN TASKS TO THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND 19 20 FINANCE COMMITTEE FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONDUCTING PERFORMANCE AUDITS. SUCH TASKS SHALL RECEIVE PRIORITY FROM THE 21 22 LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE. THE SUNSET 23 LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE MAY WAIVE, BY MAJORITY VOTE, THE 24 REQUIREMENT THAT THE PERFORMANCE AUDIT BE COMPLETED IN 25 ACCORDANCE WITH UNITED STATES GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE 26 STANDARDS AS DESCRIBED IN THE DEFINITION OF "PERFORMANCE 27 AUDIT" IN SECTION 2 UNDER THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES:

(I) THE AGENCY HAS NOT HELD ANY MEETINGS OR
CONSIDERED ANY CASES FOR A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS OR MORE;
OR

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(II) THE AGENCY HAS A BUDGET OF LESS THAN \$100,000
 ANNUALLY UNLESS THE AGENCY IS A DEPARTMENTAL BOARD OR
 COMMISSION WITHIN THE BUREAU OF PROFESSIONAL AND
 OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS, DEPARTMENT OF STATE.

5 IN THE EVENT THAT THE UNITED STATES GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE 6 STANDARDS ARE WAIVED, THE SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE SHALL 7 DIRECT THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE TO 8 COMPLETE A SUMMARY AUDIT IN LIEU OF THE PERFORMANCE AUDIT AND 9 SPECIFY THE SCOPE OF SUCH AUDIT NOT LESS THAN 16 MONTHS 10 BEFORE THE AGENCY'S TERMINATION DATE.

11 (B) SPECIAL WAIVERS. -- NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, THE SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE MAY, IN THE CASE OF AN 12 13 AGENCY THAT HAS NOT HELD ANY MEETINGS OR CONSIDERED ANY CASES 14 FOR A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS OR MORE, WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT FOR 15 THE HOLDING OF A PUBLIC HEARING FOR EVALUATION AND REVIEW OF THE 16 AGENCY. THE SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE MAY ALSO WAIVE THE 17 REQUIREMENT FOR THE PREPARATION OR COMPLETION OF A REPORT 18 OUTLINING ALL LEGISLATION THEN IN EFFECT PERTAINING TO THE 19 CREATION, OPERATION, DUTIES, POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE AGENCY 20 FROM THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU.

21 SECTION 5. EVALUATION AND REVIEW.

(A) HEARING.--EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 4(B), THE
STANDING COMMITTEE SHALL HOLD AT LEAST ONE PUBLIC HEARING FOR
EACH EVALUATION AND REVIEW OF AN AGENCY. AT THE HEARING, THE
HIGHEST RANKING OFFICER OF THE AGENCY OR AN INDIVIDUAL APPOINTED
BY THAT OFFICER SHALL BEAR THE BURDEN TO TESTIFY CONCERNING THE
NEED FOR CONTINUED EXISTENCE OF THE AGENCY. THE STANDING
COMMITTEE SHALL RECEIVE OTHER TESTIMONY AT THE PUBLIC HEARING AS
IT SHALL DEEM APPROPRIATE.

ELICIT INFORMATION IN EACH EVALUATION AND REVIEW OF AN AGENCY 1 2 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF THE AUDITOR GENERAL AND THE OFFICE OF THE 3 BUDGET AS TO THE FINANCIAL EFFICIENCY OF THE AGENCY BEING 4 REVIEWED. THE STANDING COMMITTEE MAY REQUEST, AND THE AGENCY 5 SUBJECT TO TERMINATION SHALL PROVIDE, SUCH INFORMATION AS THE STANDING COMMITTEE DEEMS PERTINENT TO ITS EVALUATION AND REVIEW. 6 7 (C) DETERMINATION. -- THE STANDING COMMITTEE SHALL MAKE A 8 DETERMINATION IN EACH EVALUATION AND REVIEW AS TO WHETHER TO 9 RECOMMEND THAT THE AGENCY SHALL BE CONTINUED, ALTERED OR 10 TERMINATED. THE REPORT 6 7 SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION IN THE OFFICE OF THE 8 SECRETARY OF THE SENATE AND OF THE CHIEF CLERK OF THE HOUSE OF 9 REPRESENTATIVES. THE REPORT SHALL BE MADE TO THE GENERAL 10 ASSEMBLY NOT LESS THAN FOUR MONTHS BEFORE THE AGENCY'S 11 TERMINATION DATE. ANY 14 15 PROGRAMS, ACTIVITIES OR FUNCTIONS OF ANY AGENCY SCHEDULED FOR TERMINATION WHICH ARE TRANSFERRED TO ANOTHER AGENCY NOT 16 17 SCHEDULED FOR TERMINATION OR SCHEDULED FOR TERMINATION AT A 18 LATER DATE, SHALL BE SUBJECT TO SUNSET REVIEW AT THE DATE SCHEDULED FOR THE TERMINATION OF THE TRANSFEROR AGENCY. ANY 19 20 PROGRAMS, ACTIVITIES OR FUNCTIONS OF ANY AGENCY SCHEDULED FOR 21 TERMINATION WHICH ARE TRANSFERRED TO ANOTHER AGENCY SCHEDULED 22 FOR TERMINATION AT AN EARLIER DATE SHALL BE SUBJECT TO SUNSET 23 REVIEW AT THE DATE SCHEDULED FOR TERMINATION OF THE TRANSFEREE 24 AGENCY. HOWEVER, BETWEEN THE TIME AT WHICH THE LEGISLATIVE 25 BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE SUBMITS ITS PERFORMANCE AUDIT TO 26 THE STANDING COMMITTEE AND THE STANDING COMMITTEE MAKES ITS 27 RECOMMENDATION TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE GOVERNOR MAY NOT 28 UTILIZE A REORGANIZATION PLAN, EXECUTIVE ORDER, RULE OR REGULATION OR COMPARABLE AUTHORITY TO TRANSFER ANY PROGRAMS, 29 30 ACTIVITIES OR FUNCTIONS OF AN AGENCY BEING EVALUATED.

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(E) ADVISORY AGENCIES. -- THE TERMINATION OF ANY AGENCY UNDER 1 2 THIS ACT SHALL SERVE TO TERMINATE ANY ADVISORY AGENCY, WHETHER 3 CREATED BY STATUTE OR ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION, ESTABLISHED FOR THE 4 PRIMARY PURPOSE OF ADVISING OR ASSISTING THE TERMINATED AGENCY. 5 (F) WINDUP PERIOD. -- AGENCIES TERMINATED SHALL BE GIVEN SIX MONTHS FROM THE TERMINATION DATE TO WIND UP THEIR AFFAIRS. 6 7 DURING THAT PERIOD, THE GOVERNOR MAY PETITION THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FOR A REVIEW OF THE TERMINATION; BUT THE AGENCY SHALL 8 9 BE TERMINATED UNLESS THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY PASSES A LAW TO THE 10 CONTRARY.

(G) TERMS OF OFFICE.--THE TERMS OF OFFICE OF MEMBERS OF AN AGENCY TERMINATED UNDER THIS ACT SHALL END SIX MONTHS FROM THE TERMINATION DATE. HOWEVER, THESE MEMBERS SHALL CONTINUE TO HOLD OFFICE FOR THE TERMS SET FORTH IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMISSIONS OF OFFICE IF THE AGENCY IS REESTABLISHED.

16 SECTION 7. REESTABLISHMENT OR CONTINUATION OF AGENCIES.

PRESIDING OFFICERS OF EACH HOUSE SHALL CAUSE TO BE PLACED ON

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THE DATE TWO MONTHS PRIOR TO THE TERMINATION DATE THE QUESTION,
 IN THE FORM OF A RESOLUTION, OF WHETHER AN AGENCY SCHEDULED FOR
 TERMINATION SHALL BE CONTINUED. IF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS
 ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE APPROVE SUCH A RESOLUTION AND THE
 RESOLUTION IS APPROVED AND TAKES EFFECT PURSUANT TO SECTION 9 OF
 ARTICLE III OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA PRIOR TO THE
 SCHEDULED TERMINATION DATE, THE AGENCY SHALL BE CONTINUED FOR A
 PERIOD OF TEN YEARS.

9 (C) RESOLUTION FOR SPECIFIC PERIOD CONTINUATION.--IF 10 RESOLUTIONS ARE INTRODUCED UNDER SUBSECTION (B), THE LEADERSHIP 11 COMMITTEE MAY CAUSE TO BE PLACED ON THE RESPECTIVE CALENDARS OF 12 EACH HOUSE A RESOLUTION CONTINUING THE AGENCY FOR A DEFINITE 13 PERIOD. IF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE 14 APPROVE SUCH A RESOLUTION AND THE RESOLUTION IS APPROVED AND 15 TAKES EFFECT PURSUANT TO SECTION 9 OF ARTICLE III OF THE 16 CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA PRIOR TO THE SCHEDULED TERMINATION 17 DATE, THE AGENCY SHALL BE CONTINUED FOR THE PERIOD SPECIFIED IN 18 THE RESOLUTION.

(D) PRIORITY.--ANY STATUTE WHICH TERMINATES OR REENACTS AN
AGENCY SHALL CONTROL OVER ANY PROCEDURE PRESCRIBED BY THIS ACT
FOR THE CONTINUATION OR TERMINATION OF AN AGENCY. NO STATUTE
SHALL BE DEEMED TO CONTINUE AN AGENCY BEYOND A TERMINATION DATE
ESTABLISHED FOR THE AGENCY PURSUANT TO THIS ACT UNLESS THE
STATUTE EXPRESSLY REENACTS THE AGENCY IN ITS PRESENT OR ALTERED

26 SECTION 8. NEWLY CREATED AGENCIES.

AN AGENCY CREATED AFTER JANUARY 1, 1992, SHALL BE SCHEDULED
FOR TERMINATION AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE TENTH YEAR FOLLOWING
ITS CREATION UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

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1 SECTION 9. TERMINATION PROCEDURES.

2 (A) RECORDS AND PROPERTY.--RECORDS AND PROPERTY OF AN AGENCY

6 RETENTION OF RECORDS.

7 (B) FUNDS.--ALL APPROPRIATIONS TO AND FUNDS OF THE AGENCY NOT SPENT OR ENCUMBERED SHALL LAPSE WHEN THE EXISTENCE OF THE 8 9 AGENCY ENDS. NO AGENCY, PRIOR TO THE DATE IN A FISCAL YEAR ON 10 WHICH IT IS SCHEDULED TO BE TERMINATED, SHALL EXPEND IN EXCESS 11 OF THE PROPORTION OF ANY GENERAL APPROPRIATION, FEDERAL AUGMENTATION, APPROPRIATION OR SIMILAR APPROPRIATION MADE TO THE 12 13 AGENCY FOR THAT FISCAL YEAR WHICH IS EQUIVALENT TO THE 14 PROPORTION OF THE FISCAL YEAR THAT WILL ELAPSE BY THE 15 TERMINATION DATE. HOWEVER THE AGENCY MAY UTILIZE A PORTION OF 16 THE UNEXPENDED BALANCE OF THE APPROPRIATIONS TO CONCLUDE ITS 17 AFFAIRS. THE SUNSET LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE SHALL HAVE THE ABILITY 18 TO WAIVE THE RESTRICTIONS ON EXPENDITURES SET FORTH IN THIS 19 SECTION UPON A SHOWING BY THE AGENCY OF EXCEPTIONAL 20 CIRCUMSTANCES.

(C) PERSONNEL.--THE EMPLOYMENT OF ALL PERSONNEL OF THE
TERMINATED AGENCY SHALL BE TERMINATED. THIS SUBSECTION SHALL NOT
BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT THE EMPLOYEES FROM APPLYING FOR AND
BEING EMPLOYED BY OTHER AGENCIES OR DEPARTMENTS TO FILL JOB
VACANCIES.

(D) EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.--EMPLOYEES OF AGENCIES TERMINATED
 UNDER THIS ACT WHO HAVE CIVIL SERVICE STATUS OR WHO ARE COVERED
 BY UNION CONTRACTS SHALL FILL ANY EXISTING VACANCIES WITHIN THE
 ADMINISTRATIVE BRANCH OF STATE GOVERNMENT IN THEIR GRADE AND
 POSITION. IF THERE ARE MORE EMPLOYEES THAN VACANT POSITIONS AT
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THE TIME OF TERMINATION, THEN TERMINATED EMPLOYEES SHALL RECEIVE

14 SECTION 11. ACCESS TO RECORDS AND WITNESSES.

15 THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE COMMITTEE AND ITS 16 AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE SHALL, FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXAMINATION 17 AND AUDIT AUTHORIZED BY THIS ACT, HAVE READY ACCESS TO PERSONS 18 AND MAY EXAMINE AND COPY TO THE EXTENT DEEMED NECESSARY TO ITS 19 EVALUATION AND REVIEW PERTINENT RECORDS, ACCOUNTS, PAPERS, 20 REPORTS, VOUCHERS, CORRESPONDENCE, BOOKS AND OTHER DOCUMENTATION 21 OF ANY COMMONWEALTH AGENCY.

22 SECTION 12. AUTHORITY TO ADMINISTER OATHS, SUBPOENA WITNESSES23 AND RECORDS AND TAKE DEPOSITIONS.

24 FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS ACT, THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND 25 FINANCE COMMITTEE, WITH THE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF BOTH 26 HOUSES, SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO COMPEL THE ATTENDANCE OF 27 WITNESSES AND THE PRODUCTION OF ANY PAPERS, BOOKS, ACCOUNTS AND DOCUMENTS, TO SUBPOENA WITNESSES, TO TAKE TESTIMONY UNDER OATH, 28 29 TO CAUSE THE DEPOSITION OF WITNESSES RESIDING WITHIN OR WITHOUT 30 THE COMMONWEALTH TO BE TAKEN IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED BY LAW, 19910H1491B4192 - 34 -

AND TO ASSEMBLE RECORDS AND DOCUMENTS BY SUBPOENA OR OTHERWISE, 1 2 WITH THE SAME POWER AND AUTHORITY AS COURTS OF RECORD AND MAY 3 APPLY TO COURTS OF RECORD FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF THESE POWERS. 4 ANY PERSON WHO WILLFULLY NEGLECTS OR REFUSES TO COMPLY WITH ANY 5 SUBPOENA ISSUED ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE BUDGET AND FINANCE 6 COMMITTEE OR REFUSES TO TESTIFY TO ANY MATTERS REGARDING WHICH 7 HE MAY BE LAWFULLY INTERROGATED SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE PENALTIES PROVIDED BY THE LAWS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH. 8

9 SECTION 13. NONSEVERABILITY.

10 IF ANY PROVISION OF SECTION 7(B) OR (C) OR ITS APPLICATION TO 11 ANY PERSON OR CIRCUMSTANCE IS HELD UNCONSTITUTIONAL UNDER THE 12 CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA IN A FINAL JUDGMENT BY THE SUPREME 13 COURT OR BY A STATEWIDE COURT, THE REMAINING PROVISIONS OR 14 APPLICATIONS OF THIS ACT ARE VOID.

15 SECTION 14. REPEALS.

16 (A) GENERAL.--ALL ACTS AND PARTS OF ACTS ARE REPEALED INSOFAR AS THEY ARE INCONSISTENT WITH THIS ACT. 17
