## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Amending the act of December 16, 1986 (P.L.1621, No.184), entitled "An act establishing and imposing powers and duties on the Office for the Deaf and Hearing Impaired in the Department of Labor and Industry; and establishing and providing powers and duties for the Advisory Council for the Deaf and Hearing Impaired in the Department of Labor and Industry," further providing for the membership of the council, and for the termination of the council.
9	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
10	hereby enacts as follows:
11	Section 1. Sections 5(a) and (b) and 7 of the act of
12	December 16, 1986 (P.L.1621, No.184), entitled "An act
13	establishing and imposing powers and duties on the Office for
14	the Deaf and Hearing Impaired in the Department of Labor and
15	Industry; and establishing and providing powers and duties for
16	the Advisory Council for the Deaf and Hearing Impaired in the
17	Department of Labor and Industry," are amended to read:
18	Section 5. Advisory Council for the Deaf and Hearing Impaired.
19	(a) CouncilThe Advisory Council for the Deaf and Hearing

Impaired, herein referred to as council, is created within the 1 2 Department of Labor and Industry and shall consist of [15] 17 members as follows: the Secretary of Public Welfare, the 3 4 Secretary of Health, the Secretary of Education, the Secretary 5 of Labor and Industry, the Secretary of Aging, or their designees; the Governor, or his designee; one member of the 6 House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the 7 House; one member of the Senate to be appointed by the President 8 9 pro tempore; and [eight] <u>nine</u> members of the public to be 10 appointed by the Governor.

11 (b) Members.--The [eight] <u>nine</u> appointed public members shall be individuals selected from schools, organizations and 12 13 non-State agencies which render services to or represent persons 14 having hearing impairments. At least four of the public members 15 shall be deaf or hearing impaired. Initially, the Governor shall designate two of the public members to serve one-year terms, two 16 17 to serve two-year terms, two to serve three-years terms and two 18 to serve four-year terms. Thereafter, all appointed members 19 shall serve for four years. The council members from State 20 offices shall serve during their tenure in office and shall 21 remain on the council until such time as a replacement is named 22 and qualified. The legislative members of the council shall 23 serve two-year terms commencing with the first Tuesday in 24 January of odd-numbered years and may be reappointed upon 25 reelection to office. [The initial legislative members' terms 26 will expire the first Tuesday in January 1987.]

December 31, [1991] 2001, when it shall terminate and go out of existence unless reestablished or continued by the General Assembly. The evaluation, review, termination, reestablishment and continuation of the agency shall be conducted pursuant to the provisions of the act of December 22, 1981 (P.L.508, No.142), known as the Sunset Act.

7 SECTION 2. THIS ACT, WITH RESPECT TO THE ADVISORY COUNCIL
8 FOR THE DEAF AND HEARING IMPAIRED, CONSTITUTES THE LEGISLATION
9 REQUIRED TO REESTABLISH THAT AGENCY UNDER THE ACT OF DECEMBER
10 22, 1981 (P.L.508, NO.142), KNOWN AS THE SUNSET ACT.
