| 13 | the first degree if he possesses a firearm or other weapon |
| 14 | concealed upon his person with intent to employ it criminally. |
| 15 | (c) DefinitionsAs used in this section the following |
| 16 | words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this |
| 17 | subsection: |
| 18 | "Anything commonly used for criminal purposes." The term |

1 includes, but is not limited to, common burglary tools, tire

2 irons, stun guns and baseball bats.

3 "Instrument of crime."

4 (1) Anything specially made or specially adapted for5 criminal use; or

6 (2) anything commonly used for criminal purposes and 7 possessed by the actor under circumstances not manifestly 8 appropriate for lawful uses it may have.

9 "Weapon." Anything readily capable of lethal use and 10 possessed under circumstances not manifestly appropriate for 11 lawful uses which it may have. The term includes a firearm which 12 is not loaded or lacks a clip or other component to render it 13 immediately operable, and components which can readily be 14 assembled into a weapon.

15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
