AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 1, 1985 (P.L.120, No.32), entitled "An act creating a special fund in the Treasury Department for 2
- 3 use in attracting major industry into this Commonwealth;
- establishing a procedure for the appropriation and use of
- 5 moneys in the fund; establishing the Tax Stabilization
- 6 Reserve Fund; and providing for expenditures from such
- 7 account," extending the use of the Sunny Day Fund moneys to
- job retention.
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 10
- 11 Section 1. Sections 102 and 104(b) of the act of July 1,
- 1985 (P.L.120, No.32), entitled "An act creating a special fund 12
- 13 in the Treasury Department for use in attracting major industry
- 14 into this Commonwealth; establishing a procedure for the
- 15 appropriation and use of moneys in the fund; establishing the
- Tax Stabilization Reserve Fund; and providing for expenditures 16

- 1 from such account," are amended to read:
- 2 Section 102. Findings and declaration of policy.
- 3 (a) Findings.--It is hereby determined and declared as a
- 4 matter of legislative finding and intent:
- 5 (1) That involuntary unemployment and its resulting
- 6 burden of indigency falls with crushing force upon the
- 7 unemployed worker and upon counties, cities, boroughs and
- 8 other local governmental jurisdictions, reducing their tax
- 9 base and impairing their financial ability to support
- 10 education and other governmental services.
- 11 (2) That the problem of unemployment, and its
- debilitating effects, has not been eliminated since the
- increased level of the economy has not fully reached all
- 14 areas of this Commonwealth, nor has the economy of this
- 15 Commonwealth as a whole reached the level of the national
- 16 economy.
- 17 (3) That the present and prospective health, safety,
- 18 morals, opportunity for gainful employment and general
- 19 welfare of the people of this Commonwealth makes desirable,
- 20 as a public purpose, the promotion and development of large
- 21 new industrial, manufacturing or research and development
- 22 enterprises.
- 23 (4) That while the Commonwealth has recently put in
- 24 place the best set of programs for small business available
- in any state, there may not be programs available which
- 26 have enough resources available to attract firms with large
- 27 numbers of new jobs available or to retain firms with jobs.
- 28 (b) Declaration of policy.--It is, therefore, declared to be
- 29 the policy of the Commonwealth to promote the health, safety,
- 30 morals, right to gainful employment and general welfare of the

- 1 inhabitants by the creation of a special account in the Treasury
- 2 Department, to be known as the Sunny Day Fund, which shall exist
- 3 for the public purpose of alleviating unemployment by attracting
- 4 large industrial, manufacturing or research and development
- 5 plants or retaining industrial, manufacturing or research and
- 6 <u>development plants</u> into this Commonwealth.
- 7 Section 104. Operation of fund.
- 8 * * *
- 9 (b) Use of funds.--Moneys in the fund shall be available to
- 10 the Governor and the Department of Commerce in their efforts to
- 11 attract or retain industrial, manufacturing or research and
- 12 development enterprises to this Commonwealth, upon approval of
- 13 an appropriation bill by a vote of two-thirds of the members
- 14 elected to the Senate and the House of Representatives. Whenever
- 15 the Governor determines that money from this fund is necessary
- 16 to attract or retain a major enterprise to this Commonwealth, he
- 17 shall present a request for an appropriation, along with the
- 18 specifics of the total proposal and such suggested ancillary and
- 19 substantive legislation as may be necessary, to the chairmen of
- 20 the House and Senate Appropriations Committees. The General
- 21 Assembly may then appropriate money from the fund in the manner
- 22 it determines necessary to accomplish the purposes set forth in
- 23 the Governor's proposal. Any money appropriated according to
- 24 this section which is then lapsed shall return to the fund.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
